Parishioners joined together for worship and fellowship on the Saturday of Lazarus and Palm Sunday. This morning I shared an episode from Steve Christoforou's "Be the Bee" series during our Divine Liturgy. Viewed amidst today's frequent backdrop of division, anger, and fear, I was encouraged with his reflection of the Saturday of Lazarus and Palm Sunday being a bridge to Holy Week and Great Pascha.

2,000 years ago at the first Palm Sunday, Steve explained the adults were too blinded by their worries, self-interests, and disputes to recognize Jesus as the true Messiah. Instead, it was children of that age who understood it was the Lord and rejoiced at His sight. They cried out "Hosanna to the Son of David" (Matthew 21:15). They laid palms on the ground as He approached. In their innocence and gentleness, they recognized Jesus for Who He is and they

rejoiced... something the educated and reasonable adults amidst them could not discern. In the days ahead, our spiritual efforts can yield harvest for us and our brethren in our midst. Please join us often to plant seeds of faith for your future and reap the joy of our mutual labors to serve in our Risen Lord's Holy Vineyard.
