
"I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die." (John 11:25)




BRIDEGROOM SERVICES, APRIL 9 - 12, 2023



Service of the Bridegroom Christ Orthodox Holy Week



HOLY THURSDAY – PASCHA, APRIL 13 - 16, 2023

Only the Lord and us know what our response will be to these holiest of days recalling the Passion of our Lord, His Crucifixion, and ultimately His Holy Resurrection. Each of us are called to be ready when the Bridegroom Christ comes in glory to judge the living and those who have fallen asleep. May we search our hearts like the sinful woman remembered on Holy Wednesday who washed the feet of Jesus with costly and fragrant oils and wiped them with her hair as pictured in the icon below. Her deep repentance is a model for us.




The hymns of the Church on Holy Tuesday provide us with added perspectives to assist us in our journey to Pascha. The sinful woman recognizes that she has strayed away from God's love through her life choices. She recovers, repents, and runs to the Savior Christ to demonstrate, in a practical manner, her desire to change her life. She wants to be delivered from the burden of sin and go about life renewed in the light of the Gospel. She wants to be reconciled to God and live her life with self-control, love, and peace. She is driven from sin to virtue. On the other side stands Judas. This disciple had experienced the miracles of Christ up close. He was taught by Christ and was even sent out to work miracles and preach the Gospel. Judas succumbs to the passion of greed. He betrays the Lord and tumbles from the light into darkness, from virtue to sin, from life to loss.


One single moment in life is sufficient to either tempt us to perish or lead us to salvation. But a sincere and simple supplication such as "Lord, have mercy," can unlock the gates of paradise when offered from the heart. We can all be complicit in Judas's betrayal, or we can personally take part in the great repentance of the sinful woman. Let us pray that the Lord grants us the willingness to recognize our sinfulness daily and seek repentance. We hope that our Lord and Savior, who suffered immensely for us, will accept our confession as precious myrrh, and save us. (from Department of Religious Education)
