






Message from Fr. George for Friday, May 12, 2023




On our Feast Day, Fr. George spoke of the picture above referencing our Patron Saint as one of four who held our Lord. Our Orthodox tradition shares that the child which St. Christopher ferried across the river revealed that he was Jesus Christ; his heaviness was due to the weight of the world which he bore. This story of the saint's carrying our Lord across the river depicts a message of hope that all Christians are called to bear and to "put on" Christ, by taking up the cross each of us has been given. St. Christopher bore his cross – Christ Himself – and ultimately suffered martyrdom for witnessing and upholding his faith, thus fulfilling our Lord's commandment: "and whoever does not take up the cross and follow Me is not worthy of Me." (Matthew 10:38)





Every May 9th, we celebrate the Patron Saint of our Parish. This short video is presented as a tribute to the countless efforts our parishioners have been offering to grow and sustain our beloved parish. It is a small way of witnessing our love for God and each other and the blessings for which we are thankful.



The great mystery of our faith is that God Himself did not come to the world as a powerful and mighty ruler to constrain everyone to repentance, to save humanity by force. He came to the Apostles as a friend, as a teacher, and continues to be with us, in our lives, in very much the same manner. The personal encounter with Christ did not end in the apostolic age.

God continues to call us to dine with Him, to break bread with Him, to drink with Him. Every time we celebrate the Divine Liturgy, this is what we live and relive, this experience of the mystery of God: God who is a friend, God who is a teacher, God who offers us unconditional love and freedom, God who trampled down death with His Resurrection. We are called to actively

participate in the life of the Church, not to be mere spectators, watching from the sidelines. Let us not come to Church simply to observe, but to participate. When we start participating, we will start to see things occurring in our lives in a more spiritual light, realigning our priorities with the freedom and love God grants all of us. 55 Maxims for Christian Living

Fr. Thomas John Hopko of blessed memory was an Eastern Orthodox Christian priest and theologian. He was the Dean of Saint Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary from 1992 until 2002. *Below are 55 maxims that Fr. Tom shared are necessary for a sound Christian life.*


- 1. Be always with Christ.
- 2. Pray as you can, not as you want.
- Have a keepable rule of prayer that you do by discipline.
- Say the Lord's Prayer several times a day.
- Have a short prayer that you constantly repeat when your mind is not occupied with other things.
- 6. Make some prostrations when you pray.
- 7. Eat good food in moderation.
- 8. Keep the Church's fasting rules.

- 9. Spend some time in silence every day.
- 10. Do acts of mercy in secret.
- 11. Go to liturgical services regularly.
- Go to confession and communion regularly.
- 13. Do not engage in intrusive thoughts and feelings. Cut them off at the start.
- 14. Reveal all your thoughts and feelings regularly to a trusted person.
- 15. Read the Scriptures regularly.
- 16. Read good books a little at a time.
- 17. Cultivate communion with the saints.
- 18. Be an ordinary person.
- 19. Be polite with everyone.
- 20. Maintain cleanliness and order in your home.
- 21. Have a healthy, wholesome hobby.
- 22. Exercise regularly.

- 23. Live a day, and a part of a day, at a time.
- 24. Be totally honest, first, with yourself.
- 25. Be faithful in little things.
- 26. Do your work, and then forget it.
- 27. Do the most difficult and painful things first.
- 28. Face reality.
- 29. Be grateful for all things.
- 30. Be cheerful.
- 31. Be simple, hidden, quiet and small.
- 32. Never bring attention to yourself.
- 33. Listen when people talk to you.
- 34. Be awake and be attentive.
- 35. Think and talk about things no more than necessary.
- 36. When we speak, speak simply, clearly, firmly, and directly.

- 37. Flee imagination, analysis, figuring things out.
- 38. Flee carnal, sexual things at their first appearance.
- 39. Don't complain, mumble, murmur, or whine.
- 40. Don't compare yourself with anyone.
- 41. Don't seek or expect praise or pity from anyone.
- 42. We don't judge anyone for anything.
- 43. Don't try to convince anyone of anything.
- 44. Don't defend or justify yourself.
- 45. Be defined and bound by God alone.
- 46. Accept criticism gratefully but test it critically.
- 47. Give advice to others only when asked or obligated to do so.

- 48. Do nothing for anyone that they can and should do for themselves.
- 49. Have a daily schedule of activities, avoiding whim and caprice.
- 50. Be merciful with yourself and with others.
- 51. Have no expectations except to be fiercely tempted to your last breath.
- 52. Focus exclusively on God and light, not on sin and darkness.
- 53. Endure the trial of yourself and your own faults and sins peacefully, serenely, because you know that God's mercy is greater than your brokenness.
- 54. When we fall, get up immediately and start over.
- 55. Get help when you need it, without fear and without shame.

Commemorating The Fall of Constantinople SAINT PHOTIOS GREEK ORTHODOX NATIONAL SHRINE 2023 DRAWING COMPETITION

The Theodosion Walls - The Walls of Constantinople

In conjunction with the annual commemoration of the Fall of Constantinople, the trustees of the Saint Photios Foundation invite children ages 9-12 of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America to participate in *The Third Annual Drawing Contest*. This is an opportunity to learn about the Fall of Constantinople which marked the end of the 1000-year reign of the Byzantine Empire.

Artists are asked to research this architectural marvel begun during the reign of Theodosius II in the early 5th century. Anthemius, who was Theodosius' *Praetorian Prefect* (prime minister) at the time, is credited with supervising this three tiered perimeter. Constructed over the course of nine years, extending from the Gold Gate, the wall continued for 4 miles, stretching across the peninsula from the Sea of Marmara to the Golden Horn, expanding on the work begun in the 4th century by Emperor Constantine I.

The walls were an effective defense line for 800 years. It was the largest and strongest barricade built in either the ancient or medieval worlds. Even Attila the Hun failed in conquering the "Queen of Cities". The moat in the first tier, the 96 towers, the sentries at the ten gates are just a few of the many elements that created this highly effective line of defense.

In 1453, the Empire came to an end when the Ottomans breached Constantinople's ancient land wall after besieging the city for 55 days. Sultan Mehmet II carried out the 8-week campaign, surrounding Constantinople from land and sea while employing cannon to maintain a constant barrage of the city's formidable walls. The Empire collapsed as the City was taken on May 29, 1453.

Participants will submit drawings of the Theodosion Walls – The Walls of Constantinople, the city's most impressive surviving monuments from antiquity in today's modern-day Istanbul, Turkey.

- 3. Two high-definition photographs of drawings; one of the drawing itself (alone), and one including the artist holding the original drawing.
- 4. Contact information including artist's name, age, home address, parish affiliation, and parent or guardian's email address. Must be submitted with the Parental Authorization to Share Photo of Artist in Shrine Special Exhibit Area (attached)






