

Message from Fr. George for Friday, May 5, 2023



The Myrrh-Bearing Women are the first to learn of the most extraordinary event of all time, which changes the course of history and provides an answer to what has plagued humanity from the beginning. The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ puts an end to death and dying, once and for all. It is not the apostles, nor the other disciples, but the Myrrh-Bearing Women who first learn of the most fundamental event in our faith. As the Kontakion hymn for the Sunday of the Holy Myrrh-Bearers reads, "In saying Rejoice to the myrrh-bearers, You allayed the lament of the first mother Eve, at Your Resurrection, O Christ our God. And You ordered Your Apostles to proclaim, 'The Savior has risen from the sepulcher (tomb).'"

The Myrrh-Bearing Women are faithful and loyal to Christ until His death and beyond. They had ministered to Him out of their own possessions. Following His death, they come to the tomb to anoint His Body with myrrh oils because they love Him. They do not even fear the Jewish leaders or the Roman soldiers who would have been expected to be guarding the tomb. This is why the Lord chose them, and why they are blessed to be the first ones to experience the Resurrection of Christ. Jesus could have revealed His risen self to any one of the Apostles, but He chose the Myrrh-Bearing Women.

Let us consider for a moment what this means for us today. In the Church, women are a fundamental building block of the faith. In the Gospel, the remarkable role of women is highlighted from the very beginning. It is women who have shouldered from the beginning of the Church most of the responsibility for initiating children into the faith. It is, for the most part, women who continue to undertake this task today. It is women who continue to offer themselves, who continue to serve as the hands and feet of Christ throughout our parishes today.



From this point of view, it is not surprising that it was women who were the first to be told of Christ's Resurrection because it was women who went to the tomb. It was women who had the courage to accompany Christ during His arrest and trial. It was women who were present when Christ was crucified. Women did all of this without really knowing for sure how things would turn out. They did all of this without understanding who Christ really was. They did all of this without fully understanding His significance, not only for themselves, but for the entire world, and its salvation. This is the example that the Church provides for us today, for all of us to follow, as well as conveying the privileged place of women in the Church from

the beginning. Let us all be inspired by the Myrrh-Bearing Women but let us especially help our younger women learn more about the female disciples of Christ. The Myrrh-Bearing Women embody the essence of what it means to serve Christ and others. They are the very definition of holiness, of reaching our ultimate potential as persons created in the image and likeness of God. (From Archdiocese Department of Religious Education)

Once there was a woman of ill repute in a city.


She had many lovers.

The whistlers are the demons.


But our soul can always find refuge with the Lord.



Commemorating The Fall of Constantinople SAINT PHOTIOS GREEK ORTHODOX NATIONAL SHRINE 2023 DRAWING COMPETITION

The Theodosion Walls - The Walls of Constantinople

In conjunction with the annual commemoration of the Fall of Constantinople, the trustees of the Saint Photios Foundation invite children ages 9-12 of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America to participate in *The Third Annual Drawing Contest*. This is an opportunity to learn about the Fall of Constantinople which marked the end of the 1000-year reign of the Byzantine Empire.

Artists are asked to research this architectural marvel begun during the reign of Theodosius II in the early 5th century. Anthemius, who was Theodosius' *Praetorian Prefect* (prime minister) at the time, is credited with supervising this three tiered perimeter. Constructed over the course of nine years, extending from the Gold Gate, the wall continued for 4 miles, stretching across the peninsula from the Sea of Marmara to the Golden Horn, expanding on the work begun in the 4th century by Emperor Constantine I.

The walls were an effective defense line for 800 years. It was the largest and strongest barricade built in either the ancient or medieval worlds. Even Attila the Hun failed in conquering the "Queen of Cities". The moat in the first tier, the 96 towers, the sentries at the ten gates are just a few of the many elements that created this highly effective line of defense.

In 1453, the Empire came to an end when the Ottomans breached Constantinople's ancient land wall after besieging the city for 55 days. Sultan Mehmet II carried out the 8-week campaign, surrounding Constantinople from land and sea while employing cannon to maintain a constant barrage of the city's formidable walls. The Empire collapsed as the City was taken on May 29, 1453.

Participants will submit drawings of the Theodosion Walls – The Walls of Constantinople, the city's most impressive surviving monuments from antiquity in today's modern-day Istanbul, Turkey.

Supporting YOCAMA

While the Prayer Shawl Ministry is about shawls, we also try to assist our partnering organizations in other ways. Supporting the Young Orthodox Christian American Mission Adventures (YOCAMA) financially is one way to do so. Participating in a Mission Trip with your teens and young adult family members is another. YOCAMA sponsors mission trips to Native American Indian Reservations to provide medical, dental, vision and developmental screenings for pre-school children.

"YOCAMA is an independent, non-profit organization. We seek to provide teens and young adults an opportunity to share the experience of working side-by-side with Native Americans who are helping to improve the quality of life in their own communities in the Navajo and Blackfeet reservations. Missionaries pay their own travel and lodging expenses. We rely on fundraising and donations to support our medical, food distribution and construction projects. Donations are fully tax-deductible. Annual fundraising and donations from missionaries and their parishes from throughout the Greek Orthodox churches in North America and with other interested organizations, support our medical, social welfare and construction projects.

Since 2008, over 1,000 missionaries have participated in trips to New Mexico and Montana. In addition to pre-school screenings, we built houses, completed building renovations, and delivered food and firewood to families in remote parts of the reservations.

YOCAMA supports Native American families by partnering with local organizations such as <u>St. Bonaventure's</u> or the <u>De La Salle Blackfeet School</u>. They aim to support and enhance the great work being done by these groups, while providing additional funding and manpower."

We had 10 beautiful shawls donated. Many thanks to Faye Georgeo, Julie Skouteris, Presbytera Marinda Tsahakis, and Susan Kleto for the donation of time and talents.

2023 YOCAMA: Young Orthodox Christian American Mission Adventures Summer Trips

Our home base for the Summer 2023 trip is Gallup, NM. We will work on the following projects:

Medical and developmental screenings: The medical screening team includes pediatricians/physicians, registered nurses, pulmonary tech, dentist, several pre-med/dental students as well as adult and high school volunteers. In partnership with Saint Bonaventure, our team hosts Health Fairs providing medical and dental screenings, a hot lunch, food boxes and supplies and craft activities on various remote locations on the Navajo reservation.

Construction. In partnership with St. Bonaventure, our team provides assistance with home repairs and other vital construction projects as well as renovations to the St Bonaventure School. Many of the Navajo homes need to be rebuilt because of fire damage from the kettle stoves used to heat the homes.

Outreach. We deliver food and water to Navajo families throughout the Eastern communities of the Navajo Nation. Food is donated by the Philoptochos Society at St. George Greek Orthodox Church in Albuquerque. Water delivery is provided by appointment through St. Bonaventure Mission and Dig Deep.

Food Pantry. Prepare food delivery boxes, work at their gardens, distribute food at the pantry and sort food donations at the <u>Community Pantry</u> in Gallup, NM.

Our home base for the Summer 2023 trip will be Browning, Montana. We work on the following projects:

Repair and paint classrooms and teacher's housing at the <u>De La Salle Blackfeet School</u> in Browning, MT.

Work in the classrooms and serve lunches and dinners to students.

Build a playset and repair a playground for the disadvantaged children in Heart Butte MT.

Help with food pantry/clothes distribution center in Heart Butte MT.
