

Again, make and bring your favorite family food – whether soup, sandwiches, your favorite meats, sides, salads, or beverages.




















The Meeting of Our Lord in the Temple

Throughout the Nativity cycle, we have celebrated the appearing of the Lord in the flesh—in Bethlehem as an infant, in the Jordan as a full-grown man, and now in the temple as a sacrifice. 
