Philoptochos Celebrates a Successful Operation Classroom Ministry

<u>TEACHERS</u>: Resourceful, committed, and sometimes, awe inspiring. But teachers also seem to translate "doing more with less" by dipping into their own pockets to supply their classroom needs.

St. Christopher's Philoptochos decided to implement their Operation Classroom Ministry in a format to aid these teachers. In 5 years, we have granted approximately \$7,000.00, of hard-earned Fall Pastry Sale receipts, to reimbursed teachers for their classroom supplies and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) activity kits, helped purchase over 500 books so students had their own book to take home and read during the summer, and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) activity supplies making an impact for thousands of students in Fayette and Coweta Counties.

Our final year of Operation Classroom is yielding amazing results through the efforts of Coach T (aka Mary Thompson). Students at Coweta County's Welch Elementary School, through their STEAM program learned about war veterans and thanked veterans at the Newnan VFW for their service with "Veterans Rock" hand painted rocks this past Veterans Day. Coach T stated the purpose of the activity was to help her students learn about the sacrifices veterans make for all of us and "to show their appreciation to our hometown heroes." One 5th Grade student made a video about the importance of celebrating Veterans Rock and recently was awarded 2nd Place in the Regional Georgia Student Technology Competition.

A second activity funded through this grant had all the second and third grade students (14 classes) participating in this year's "Symbolic Monarch Butterfly Migration". The program was created by the Environmental Education Alliance, Inc. For 28 years, the project has helped students in the U.S. and Canada connect with students living near Mexican Monarch sanctuaries. The Welch students created symbolic, life-sized butterflies and sent them to the Mexican students for the winter. Those students



will protect the butterflies for the winter and then send them back in the spring of 2024 (a butterfly pen pal program). The program promotes "authentic lessons of conservation, cooperation, and ambassadorship," Coach T says. Utilizing their school's STEM garden, the students learned about the plants, especially milkweed, the butterflies require to live and reproduce. This garden is a part of the Rosalynn Carter Butterfly Trail.

The final activity our Operation Classroom grant helped fund involves the students learning about the post-

presidential legacy and activities of Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter. The students are learning about their involvement with Habitat for Humanity, the work done by the Carter Center, their efforts to eradicate the Guinea Worm, the Rosalynn Carter Butterfly Trail, and more. The students will relate what they have learned through various art projects. These art projects will then be placed on display at the Nixon Centre, Newnan for March and April.

All parishioners of St. Christopher's are invited to attend the Jimmy Carter Exhibit Open House on Tuesday, March 26, 2024, from 5-7 pm in the Black Box Area of the Nixon Centre for the Performing and Visual Arts, 1523 Lower Fayetteville Rd, Newnan, GA 30265. Welch Elementary students will serve as Docents for the exhibit and Philoptochos will be recognized as one of the grantors of this special educational opportunity.





ACADEMIC and ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 out of 4.0 (or 83 out of 100) and be planning to be
enrolled full-time at an accredited college or university for the 2024 – 25 academic year to be eligible.

AREA OF CONSIDERATION and RESIDENCY / OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- Several scholarships will be awarded based on scholastic achievement.
- Several scholarships will be awarded based on both scholastic achievement and financial need.
- One scholarship will be awarded in recognition of a scholar-athlete.
 - Applicants for the above 3 categories must reside in the Greater Metropolitan Atlanta Area.
- One scholarship is designated for a student pursuing a graduate degree in Nursing.
 - Applicants must reside in the state of Georgia and plan to be enrolled in a graduate nursing program approved by the Georgia Board of Nursing.
- Three scholarships are available for students attending Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology.
 Applicants must reside in the geographical area within the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Atlanta and plan to attend Holy Cross School of Theology.
- The Johnny N. Economy Scholarship is available to all students.
 - Applicants must submit an additional essay on a topic of their choosing regarding Hellenism. This scholarship has no residency requirement.

Note that unless you are from the greater Metro Atlanta area, your residency status is considered "out of area" regardless of your current address, and with the exceptions noted above (Graduate Nursing & Holy Cross student applications) you are only eligible to apply for the Johnny N. Economy Scholarship.
