











Yes, Lord and King, give me the power to see my own faults and not to judge my brother. For You are blessed unto the ages of ages. Amen.








On March 25th, Feast of the Annunciation to the Theotokos, we celebrated the Good News of Jesus'

SAINT PHOTIOS GREEK ORTHODOX NATIONAL SHRINE 2024 DRAWING COMPETITION IN

COMMEMORATION OF THE FALL OF CONSTANTINOPLE

The Saint Photios Greek Orthodox National Shrine announces the Fourth Annual Drawing Competition, underwritten by the Toundas family of Jacksonville, Florida. All children ages 9-12 of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America are invited to submit a drawing of this famous 13th century mosaic, the Deesis.



Located in the upper south gallery of Hagia Sophia, this icon was concealed for centuries after the Fall of Constantinople in 1453.

The Virgin Mary and John the Baptist turn to Christ, the Son of God. The figures are two and a half times larger than life.

After a very tumultuous time in the Queen City, the icon was likely commissioned in 1261 by Emperor Michael VIII Paleologos. He reclaimed the Byzantine capital after the Latin period. The south gallery was traditionally reserved for imperial use.

ELIGIBILITY: This competition is open to all children ages 9-12 of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. There are no fees for participation.

PRIZE: One grand prize of \$250.00.

DUE DATE: All submissions must be sent in jpeg format with a photo of the artist. The drawing and photo must be received at info@stphotios.com by **Friday, May 17, 2024** with Drawing Contest 2024 in the subject of the email. The Winner will be announced on Wednesday, May 29, 2024 at the Fall of Constantinople Commemoration Memorial which will be streamed on the St. Photios National Shrine Facebook page.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- One 2-dimensional drawing of Haghia Sophia, on 8 ½" by 11" paper (landscape/horizontal view). All submissions will become property of the Saint Photios National Shrine.
- The following media (or combination of media) may be used: crayon, marker, colored pencil, watercolor paint.
- Two high-definition photographs of drawings; one of the drawing itself (alone), and one including the artist holding the original drawing.
- Contact information including artist's name, age, home address, parish affiliation, and parent or guardian's
 email address. Once this information is received, a parental consent form will be emailed, authorizing use
 of the photos solely for the purpose of the Drawing Contest ministry.
