

Pastoral Message from Fr. George, October 8, 2025

Beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,



A special gift from God is my family's beloved Caleb, a Mountain Cur whose drawing you see—a sketch that captures not only his form, but his spirit. Caleb is not just a dog. He is a companion in the truest sense. His loyalty is unwavering, his discernment keen, his presence a balm in times of trial.

Mountain Curs are known for their intelligence, their endurance, and their protective instincts. Caleb embodies all of these. He often senses danger before it arrives. He guides us with quiet confidence. He remains faithful in chaos and steady in uncertainty. In his eyes, I see the watchfulness of a shepherd and in his posture, the strength of a guardian. He chooses to stay near us, to protect, to love—not out of duty, but out of something deeper. Something revered.

I named our dog **Caleb** because of the strong devotion the Old Testament Caleb had for God. His unwavering faith and courage continue to inspire me—not only through Holy Scripture, but through the past 12 years of daily companionship from our adopted dog we found as a stray to the Diakonia Retreat Center. Had we not adopted him, he would have been taken to a shelter and euthanized. Our choosing him is God's reminder to us that we receive new blessings each day. Caleb's trust and devotion resemble his Old Testament namesake.

From the biblical accounts, we see Caleb as a faithful man who trusted God to fulfill His promises, even when others allowed fear to override their small faith. His devotion did not waver with age; into his later years, Caleb remained steadfast in belief and obedience. God blessed him for his faithfulness and patience, and his life stands as a powerful encouragement for us to believe God wholeheartedly.


Like the biblical Caleb, we, God's people, are called to follow Him in every circumstance—patiently waiting for our Lord to fulfill His

promises and ready to act when the time is right. In our own lives, may we reflect the same trust and devotion. I am reminded of this daily through Caleb, whose loyalty is unwavering and whose trust in me and his family is complete. He follows us without hesitation, listens to our voices, and rests peacefully in our presence—never questioning our care and never doubting our intentions. His devotion is not earned through grand gestures, but through the quiet consistency of love and presence. In many ways, Caleb's companionship mirrors the kind of faith we are called to have in our relationship with God: a faith that walks beside Him without fear, that waits patiently for His guidance, and that responds with readiness when He calls. Through Caleb—both the faithful servant of Scripture and my beloved companion—I am reminded of the profound blessings that come from walking loyally and trustingly with our Lord.

In response to the gifts we receive from our animal companions, I invite our St. Christopher families to join me for a few minutes as I honor our beloved animal companions through prayer and blessing. All our pets—large and small—are welcome!



This will be a family opportunity for us to thank God and to bless our pets for their loyalty, their love, and their companionship that do not ask for anything in return. May we learn from them. May we be as faithful, as discerning, and as courageous. And may we never forget to give thanks—for the seen and unseen blessings that walk beside us every day.

If you join us, please clean up after your pet so we leave this nature trail near our parish's backyard as nice as when we arrived. For this event, we will not be distributing treats to pets or people or any handouts... just Fr. George's animal blessings! 




A Spiritual Reflection from Fr. George - "Let Us Welcome All"

Not too far from our parish, we encounter this intersection—marked by the sign "Welcome All Road". As we gaze upon this image, we are reminded that the road to God's heart is never closed, never gated, and never reserved for a select few. It is open, wide, and paved with grace. Just as this



road welcomes every traveler, regardless of where they've come from or where they're headed, so too does our parish welcome every soul into our midst.

In the life of the Church, we are not merely spectators—we are participants. Each person who walks through our doors brings with them a sacred offering: their time, their talents, their stories. And when these gifts are shared, they become part of our collective worship, returning thanks to God and building up the Body of Christ.

Let the above image be a gentle nudge to us all: to greet the stranger with warmth, to honor the quiet contributions of others, and to recognize that in welcoming all, we welcome Christ Himself. later in the week. This past Monday, Presbytera Marinda toasted ours and served it with breakfast, reminding us once more of the special blessings we witnessed during the October commemorations highlighting our birthdays, anniversaries, Name Days, and more from our parish family.

On the third year following the falling asleep of her beloved father, Maxim, I commend Larisa for asking me to offer the Memorial Service using the traditional koliva she made and shared with her parish family. Sometimes we forget that it is you and I who stand in for





her relatives living far away in Russia like we did this past Sunday. A heartfelt thank you to Larisa for sharing her special ethnic dishes. The flavors and stories carried with them a deep sense of heritage and love, and we were honored to partake in such a meaningful tribute.

Calling exceptional undergraduate students of Hellenic descent - consider becoming a PanHellenic Scholar!

Do you or an exceptional undergraduate student you know qualify to be a PanHellenic Scholar? The 2025/2026 application is now open and accepting applications!

APPLY TODAY!

The Foundation will accept applications from eligible Greek American college students and will distribute \$250,000 in scholarship awards to exceptional undergraduates as follows:

- Twenty (20) Awards of \$10,000 based on academic achievement, financial need, and Hellenic engagement. (\$20,000 given specifically for students studying music or arts).
- Twenty (20) Awards of \$2,500 based on academic achievement and Hellenic engagement.

Eligible undergraduate students of Hellenic descent from all fifty states are encouraged to apply. If a student applied in a prior year, and are still in college, we encourage them to reapply.

Applications should be submitted electronically as instructed by January 31, 2026.

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship, applicants must:

- · Be US Citizens or US permanent residents.
- · Be of Hellenic descent.
- Be enrolled at an accredited U.S. college or university for Fall 2025 and actively in your sophomore, junior, or senior year
- · Have a minimum 3.6 cumulative GPA.
