

On this crisp autumn morning, the oak trees around Peachtree City whisper in the wind, their golden leaves dancing like prayers rising to heaven. Inside the hearts of 56 families, a different kind of whisper began stirring months earlier—answering a call to join in the building of something lasting, something sacred. It wasn't just about bricks and mortar; it was about faith, hope, and love woven into the very foundation of St. Christopher Church.

Indeed, since March, our families have prayerfully considered and been offering their five-year pledges to **raise \$1.5 million**—a goal that ensures we can complete construction of our long-awaited church project by the beginning of 2026. It was a bold vision, rooted in faith and hope, and entrusted to the hearts of our parish family. As your Priest, I am in awe of your response... your generosity. Each pledge is more than a number on paper. It is a story of trust in God's providence. Some families gave from

abundance, others from sacrifice, but all are giving willingly with hearts full of thanksgiving. Like the widow's two coins, these offerings have become treasures in heaven; they form the cornerstone of a spiritual home for generations yet unborn. They unite us with God's blessings and build upon the solid foundation of our 22-year history of growing our parish to what it is today.



Dear Parishioners:

This year we will be electing three (3) parishioners to the Parish Council to serve a three (3) – year term. Elections will be held on Sunday, December 14, 2025, from 10:45 a.m. until 12:45 p.m. There is no absentee balloting or proxy voting. There is no limit to the number of nominees.

Nomination of candidates begins Wednesday, November 19th and continues through Sunday, November 30th at 11:30 a.m. If you wish to be nominated, you must use the attached form. The fully signed form must be received by this deadline by one of the Board of Elections members elected at the General Parish Assembly on November 23rd. They include Aimee Panos, Julie Torres, Angelique Soulakos, and Marcus Sprague. During weekday office hours, you can hand deliver to Jackie Sarantis for her to give to one of the four Board members by the deadline.

Qualifications to be a Candidate for the Parish Council – Candidates of the Parish Council must be a parishioner in good standing of the Parish for at least one (1) year immediately preceding the date of the election and must live his or her life in accordance with the faith and canons of the Church. The Priest shall determine whether the parishioners are in canonical and financial good standing as specified in Part Three, Article 18, Sections 1-3 of the Uniform Parish Regulations. All candidates must attend a seminar prior to the election of members of the Parish Council. The purpose of the seminar will be to learn the Uniform Parish Regulations and Affirmation of Office. At the conclusion of the seminar, all candidates will acknowledge their attendance by signing the Parish Council Candidate Pledge as promulgated by the Metropolitan and agreeing to abide by it if elected. This year's mandatory Parish Council Candidate Training Seminar will be via Zoom on Monday, December 1st at 7:00 p.m. All Candidates must attend this session to be listed on final election ballot (except for those previously trained in 2023 or later). There is no make-up session possible.




As Philoptochos members we are “friends of the poor”. We assist others with monetary gifts and gifts of our hands- whether it be prayer shawls, food drives, packing food items, making pastries or giving a hug!

Our Chapter has been so blessed this year! We've welcomed many new members into Philoptochos....including quite a few associate members. Through our very successful fundraising this year, we've supported many local and national charities, the Enthronement of His Eminence Metropolitan Sevastianos, and the retirement of His Eminence Metropolitan Alexios. Remember, EVERY time you support a Philoptochos Fundraising effort, like our Bake Sale, Stewardship Drive, Vasilopita, Fanouropita, Pascha and Nativity Cards, you are helping the needy in our community!

Let's recap 2025~

Our **Vasilopita** auction and bake sale is always so much fun and raises funds to assist children. This year we split our monies between three children's charities:

-Each receiving a check for \$5,000!!

- Paradise 4 Kids (with an international reach),
- Bloom Our Youth (a local foster care charity),
and as tradition our own
- St. Basil's Academy through our National Philoptochos (this is our Greek Orthodox home for Orthodox and non-Orthodox children and young adults located in New York).

In February we supported the **Souper Bowl of Caring** collecting over 300 cans and “passed” a soup pot collecting \$400 for Fayette Samaritans! But our big event that day was the soup cook off! With the Butler's winning 1st and 2nd place! A fun day while helping others!

Our **Prayer Shawl Ministry** is busy throughout the year creating beautiful gifts, through prayer, to wrap our love around the women who receive them. To date, this year 75 shawls have been shared! Our next prayer shawl blessing is Dec 14.

Through the summer we prepared and baked food items for **Greek Fest** while supporting our charities. The Metropolis of Atlanta held the **Nation Children's Medical Fund Luncheon** in Buckhead this year. While our chapter supported the event with monetary sponsorship, many women and men attended the luncheon and volunteered at the event. This year's luncheon raised over **\$1,000,000- shattering all previous records.**

Our **Fanaroupita** event raised over \$1700 for the Metropolis of Atlanta Youth Ministry. What a yummy silent auction and bake sale event.

That brings us to our **Fall Bake Sale**. At first we were concerned that we were going to be overwhelmed. Hoping for enough hands to help fold, roll, and bake; concerned that the sales were slow- ish. Well, worry is not of God! We were reminded of something we already knew- we never need to worry about anything when we are doing God's work! Not only did

we have many men and women help us, but we had the highest yielding sale ever! Let me share our accomplishments:

WE made:

189 dozen spanakopita
122 dozen tiropita
900 pieces of dolmathes
11 pans of Baklava 792
1400 koulourakia
350 paximadia
966 kourembiethes
780 New Almond cookies
Countless yards of ribbon made into beautiful bows

With a Grand total of \$11,253 in sales!!

These monies will go toward our Metropolis and National charitable funds for 2026, as well as support our local charities.

Thank you to those who gave their time, those who underwrote ingredients, those who purchased our tasty treats and especially all of you who prayed for us.

Finally, during our last Board meeting of 2025, we unanimously decided to help replenish 4 of our local food banks, by sending **\$500** to each of the following: **Fayette Samaritans, One Roof, I58 Mission, and MidWest Food Bank.**

A big thank you to all who have generously donated to the Philoptochos General Fund! Without your support we would not have been able to send these additional funds!!!

As you can see, we have enjoyed a successful year of fellowship, new membership, fundraising, baking, and giving. Come join us; everyone is always welcome. **In fact our next meeting is Dec. 14!**





Applications should be submitted electronically as instructed by **January 31, 2026**.
