Clarification for Parishioners asking for a Letter of Good financial & Ecclesiastical Standing

In the Orthodox Church, a Letter of Good Financial and Ecclesiastical Standing is a formal document that confirms a person's active and faithful participation in the life of the Church—both spiritually and materially. It's especially significant when someone wishes to serve as a godparent at a baptism or a sponsor at a wedding, particularly if the sacrament is taking place in a parish other than their own. To ensure it can be provided, contact Fr. George at least 4-6 weeks in advance of your need to ensure he can provide it in advance of the sacrament you have scheduled at another parish.

Here's what it typically signifies:

Ecclesiastical Standing

- The individual is a baptized and/or chrismated Orthodox Christian.
- They regularly attend Divine Liturgy and participate in the sacraments, especially Holy Communion and Confession.
- They live in accordance with Orthodox Christian teachings and moral life.
- They have no canonical impediments (e.g., being married outside the Church, unresolved ecclesiastical divorce).

Financial Standing

- The person is a **pledging steward** of their home parish.
- They contribute financially to the Church's ministries and have a stewardship commitment on file.
- This reflects not just financial support, but a commitment to the Church's mission and community life.

Why It Matters

- It ensures that sponsors or godparents are spiritually prepared and committed to guiding others in the faith.
- It maintains the integrity of the sacraments by ensuring participants are in full communion with the Church.
- It helps parishes uphold canonical order and pastoral care across jurisdictions.

 This letter is the affirmation to the Priest where the baptism or wedding will occur that the Orthodox Church blends spiritual accountability with community responsibility.
