Pastoral Message from Fr. George for Friday, June 20, 2025



Simon of Cyrene was the man forced by the Romans to carry the cross of Jesus as he was taken to his crucifixion. The incident is recorded in the three Synoptic Gospels: Mark 15:21-22, Matthew 27:32, and Luke 23:26.

I was inspired by the following reflection by Rev. Presbyter Samuel Davis, Apostolic Missionary, St Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine, and reprint it below:

St Simon of Cyrene: A Symbol of Compassion and Service

Icon of St Simon of Cyrene credit Constantine Lavdas

St. Simon of Cyrene is vividly depicted in tradition as the man who was compelled by the Roman authorities to assist Our Lord in carrying His Cross on the way to His Crucifixion. His initial reluctance transforms into an act of compassion, embodying

human fear and struggle intertwined with moments of grace and selflessness. This icon portrays St Simon with an expression of burden, reminding those who venerate the icon the unexpected burdens life can impose.

This icon of St Simon offers multiple spiritual and pedagogical purposes:

An Invitation to Compassion: By depicting Simon being compelled to serve, the icon encourages faithfulness to recognize moments when they are called upon to help others bear their burdens.

Reflection on Suffering: The scene emphasizes that suffering is a shared human experience, crossing ethnic and cultural boundaries. It prompts contemplation on the nature of suffering, both Our Lords's and that of others.

Participation in Our Lord's Passion: Simon's act of assistance connects believers with Christ's suffering, highlighting that we are called to participate in transforming suffering into compassion and love.

The story of Simon resonates deeply with the Black American narrative. Enslaved Americans and their descendants endured brutal oppression, yet their suffering often motivated acts of resilience and resistance. Like this blessed saint, Black Americans have historically been compelled to bear the burdens of racism, injustice, and violence in our nation. Simon's act of carrying Our Lord's Cross has been seen as an act of solidarity and a step forward in Our Lord's plan for the Salvation and liberation of the entire human race. It reflects the possibility that shared suffering, in the witness of shared suffering, in the witness of Martyric Salvation can lead to redemption and freedom. The intercessions of St Simon of Cyrene emphasize the culturally rich and

resilient heritage of the African diaspora. It affirms the enduring strength of Black Americans, West Indians, Afro-Latinos, and Caribbeans amid adversity. This connection enhances the understanding that the struggle for justice and freedom is rooted in a long history of resistance, faith, and communal perseverance. The Scriptures and Divine Services attached to his act of empathy invites reflection on the importance of solidarity in pursuit of liberation. Simon's presence in the story symbolizes the vital role that marginalized groups play in confronting oppression. For Africans in the diaspora reinforces a sense of historical resilience and cultural pride empowering ongoing struggles for justice, healing, and reconciliation. Suffering is an inherent aspect of human existence. Be it physical pain, emotional distress, loss or injustice. The icon of St Simon reminds us that no one is immune and that often, it is in moments of hardship that compassion and solidarity emerge most vividly.

The Orthodox Christian messages underscores that suffering can serve as a catalyst for spiritual growth, communal bonding, and empathy. Simon's act, though prompted by circumstances beyond his control, becomes a symbol of the voluntary sharing of burdens and the essential aspect of human connectedness.

This icon of St Simon of Cyrene invites us to reflect on our own encounters with suffering and the opportunities to serve others. It teaches that compassion often requires stepping into discomfort and that through acts of assistance, we participate more fully in the divine love exemplified through the offering of Our Lord on the Cross. Recognizing our shared suffering fosters a sense of community, reminding us that together, we can bear the burdens of life with grace and hope through the love of Our Lord.

This icon of St Simon of Cyrene serves as a powerful symbol within the wider narrative of suffering and liberation. His story reminds us that people of African descent have been integral to historical moments of hope and overcoming opposition. Recognizing this connection enriches the understanding of the ongoing struggle for freedom faced by Black Americans, emphasizing shared resilience, faith, and the collective pursuit of repentance.
