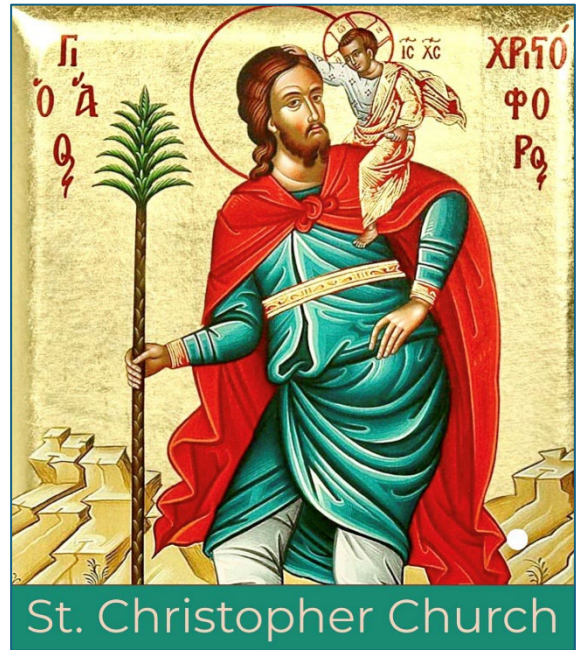


**Join Us for a Special Zoom Prayer Service

Why Join Us This Sunday?

1. Because Christ Meets Us Where We Are

a word of hope, a moment of peace, a reminder that *“God is with us.”*

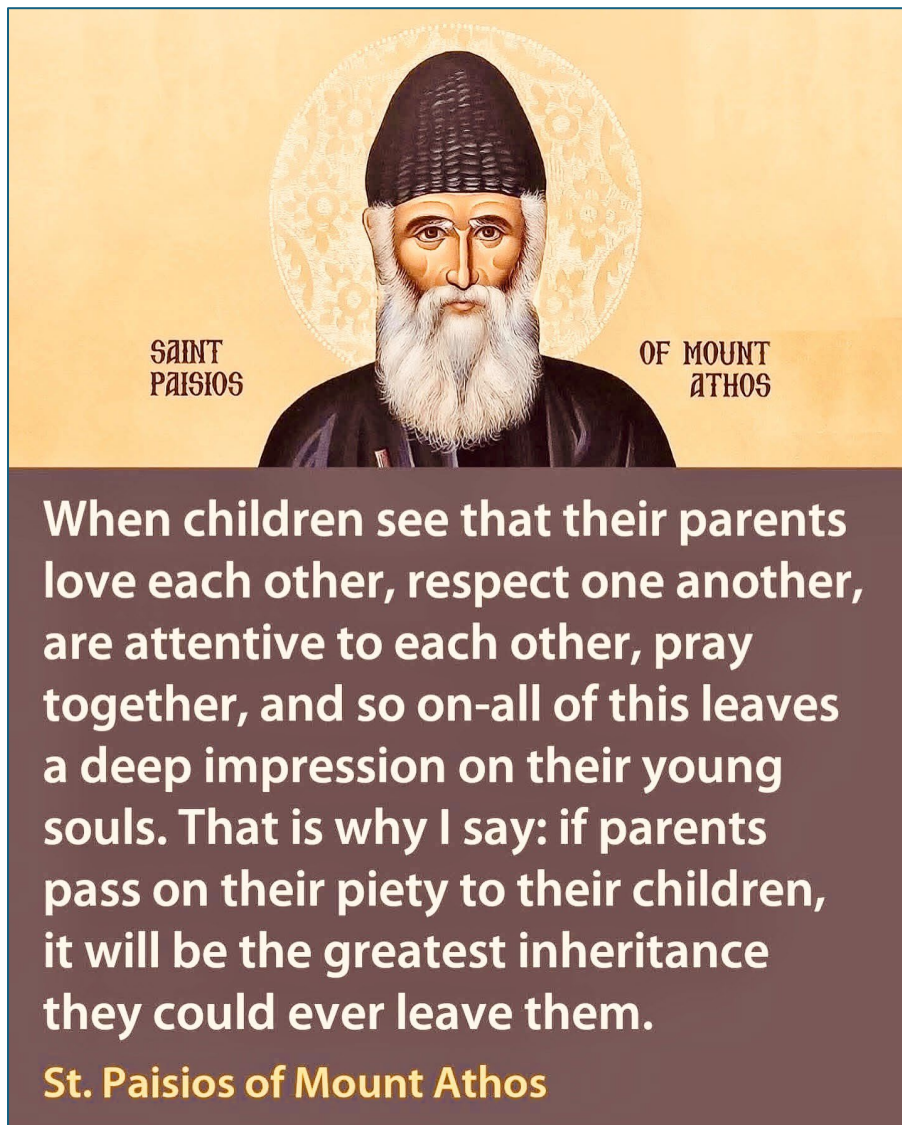
What to Expect
