
Guide him in every good work, establish him in Your holy commandments,

When the people of Israel returned from exile to rebuild the Temple, they faced unexpected obstacles, discouragement, and far fewer resources than they had hoped. Yet the

Lord spoke through the prophet Haggai, reminding them that the work was still His and that His providence had not departed from them: *"Be strong... and work, for I am with you, says the Lord of hosts"* (Haggai 2:4). Though the task before them seemed heavier and more costly than anticipated, God assured them that faithfulness—not fear—was required, and that the glory of what He was building would ultimately surpass what they could imagine.

A Parish Kitchen Story...

For years—*many* years—our parish kitchen has been a place of holy patience and heroic endurance. We didn’t talk about it much, but everyone knew the truth: our two brave parish stoves had seen better days in the two decades of their existence.

They had control knobs that liked to fall off at the most dramatic moments... usually when someone was carrying a pan of spanakopita.

The ovens had temperature dials that believed in “approximate spirituality”—you might set them to 350°, but they would respond with something between “warm as a candle flame” and “forge of Mount Olympus.” Still, we worked with them, prayed over them, and tapped them just the right way, like seasoned musicians coaxing sound from aging instruments.

And then *one day*—without fanfare, trumpets, committee meetings, or even a whisper—we walked into the kitchen and stopped in our tracks.



There they were.

Two bright, shining, fully functional, *gloriously modern* stoves. Sitting side-by-side like two stainless-steel angels ready to assist the faithful in their duties of baking, roasting, and coffee-hour preparing.

No spotlight. No announcement. No ribbon-cutting.

Just a quiet gift.

Only later did we learn that Julie and George—without wanting attention or applause—had simply seen the need and acted. Not for recognition, but out of love for their parish family and for the countless moments of hospitality, fellowship, and ministry that begin in our modest kitchen.

Because of their generous and unexpected stewardship, our cooks, bakers, and culinary volunteers can now serve the parish with more ease, more confidence, and a lot fewer loose oven handles and stove knobs.

So today, we give thanks—first to God, and then to Julie and George—for blessing our community in such a simple, beautiful, and practical way. Their generous and unexpected stewardship was offered in the same spirit as so much of the unseen ministry in our parish: quietly, prayerfully, and with love.

Because of their kindness, every tray of cookies, every potluck meal, every Lenten dish, every bake sale project will now be prepared with far less stress and far more joy.

And now, dear parish family, one important note: Since these new stoves were given with such care and generosity, let us all do our part to look after them. May we treat them gently, clean them faithfully, and use them responsibly—so that this gift may bless our community for many years to come.

With gratitude to God—and to them—may every meal prepared upon these shining helpers bring fellowship, nourishment, and joy to our parish. **+Fr. George Tsahakis**

Her face lit up.

For a moment she could not move.

She felt seen, held, and wrapped in something far bigger than herself.

Sitting there beneath the great arches, surrounded by the beauty of the Kingdom of God depicted all around her, she whispered to her best friend, *"If I am blessed to be married one day... I want it to be here."*

And in her heart, the chapel felt like home.




My brethren, this true story captures the vision of our Former Metropolitan Alexios, whose dream was to build the Panagia Chapel for the long-term future – not just for us today, but for our children’s children and for all our families who would be blessed to worship there.

Last week, His Eminence Metropolitan Sevastianos asked all clergy to invite our faithful to offer a renewed and heartfelt gift to the Alexios Retreat Center (ARC) to help complete the construction of the Panagia Chapel. This sacred project began last November to honor the retirement of His Eminence Metropolitan Alexios, whose vision and leadership blessed our Metropolis for decades. Through His guidance, this exquisite retreat center was acquired—a spiritual home that will serve generations to come. The Panagia Chapel is the centerpiece.

In thanksgiving for his devoted ministry, I feel strongly that we as a parish should step forward and support this initiative, which soon will welcome even more pilgrims and retreatants to experience the peace and beauty of the ARC.

Last November, I was thankful to be one of two families among our St. Christopher parishioners who made personal contributions in response



to the Metropolis-wide goal of raising \$500,000 to complete the Panagia Chapel. Unfortunately, that goal was not met and to prevent further delay on this project, I am seeking your help now.

Feeling strongly that every parish has an obligation to ensure that Metropolitan Alexios' vision for Panagia Chapel is achieved, I am rallying our parish with this opportunity to offer a formal gift in our parish's name supporting Metropolitan Sevastianos' renewed appeal. I invite all our parish families to join and pool what we can offer in the name of our beloved St. Christopher Church.

Please put in context that we are uniting our efforts with our 74 sister parishes across the Metropolis to help complete Metropolitan Alexios' legacy of the Panagia Chapel during this holy Lenten season—especially meaningful as we will gather every Friday for the Salutations to the Mother of God, whose blessed name "Panagia" this Chapel bears.

For this renewed effort, I am setting a parish goal of \$5,000.

To lead this offering, Presbytera Marinda and I are contributing the first ten percent—\$500. If we can raise more than our goal, that is an even greater blessing that will enable smaller parishes who are not as blessed some leeway, so that in the end Panagia Chapel is completed.

Our deadline to receive pledges and family offerings is the Friday of the Akathist Hymn to the Theotokos (March 27, 2026) so that our parish may present one unified check on behalf of the faithful of St. Christopher Church. Your donation will appear on your St. Christopher giving statement as an extra donation in addition to your stewardship and building fund gifts. Our joint parish offerings will be forwarded to the Alexios Retreat Center to help complete the construction of the Panagia Chapel.

Thank you, as always, for your generosity, your love for our Metropolis, and your desire to strengthen the ministries that nurture and renew the Holy Body of Christ. Through the prayers of the Theotokos—whose Chapel bears witness to her love and devotion to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ—may God bless and guide us in this sacred effort.







WHAT ARE WE DOING?

We will have a fun "draw by numbers" card of the Paschal icon, that can be colored and then each of us are going to create an Pascha/Easter card with a short handwritten message to mail to a person in prison.

WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

Imagine being confined to a prison cell--the isolation and sense of being cut off from the outside world. Imagine also what that is like at Pascha and having no way to mark a special and holy day. A heartfelt message on Pascha breaks through the sense of isolation and loneliness. Your card may well be the only one they receive. Your card lets our brothers and sisters in prison know that the Church remembers them, cares about them, and that they, too, are part of the Body of Christ.

The Prayer Shawl Ministry at St. Christopher's has been creating and donating handmade Prayer Shawls since 2009. These shawls are the results of the time and talents shared by our members, and friends, to craft these shawls by knitting, crocheting, weaving, or quilting them. Shawls can even be produced by decoratively finishing commercially produced fabric.

As you begin to plan your project, please keep the following guidelines in mind. Consistency in the size and finish of the shawls is important because we often give multiple shawls to one organization. We want the recipients to feel that their shawl was made specifically for them! Prayer shawls can be either triangular or rectangular but need to be long enough to wrap securely around the body. Rectangular shawls should be 20"- 26" wide and 68"- 72" long with fringe or other decorative finish at each end. Triangular shawls should be 60"- 72" across the longest side, 24"- 30" to the point with fringe along the two short sides or other decorative finish all around. Lap blankets should be 36" - 40" on each side. Yarn color is important as we are trying to uplift the spirits of the recipients of the shawls and blankets. Yarn or cloth texture is also important because we want these items to lovingly wrap the recipients in our Christian love. The finished items should be soft and drape or "scrunch" comfortably, something everyone would want to be hugged by!



ACADEMIC and ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 out of 4.0 (or 83 out of 100) and planning to be enrolled full-time at an accredited college or university for the 2026 – 2027 academic year to be eligible.

AREA OF CONSIDERATION and RESIDENCY / OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- Multiple scholarships will be awarded based on scholastic achievement.
- Multiple scholarships will be awarded based on both scholastic achievement and financial need.
- One scholarship will be awarded in recognition of a scholar-athlete.
Applicants for the above 3 categories must reside in the Greater Metropolitan Atlanta Area.
- One scholarship is designated for a student pursuing a graduate degree in Nursing.
Applicants must reside in the state of Georgia and plan to be enrolled in a graduate nursing program approved by the Georgia Board of Nursing.
- Three scholarships are available for students attending Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology.
Applicants must reside in the geographical area within the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Atlanta and plan to attend Holy Cross School of Theology.
- The Johnny N. Economy Scholarship is available to all students.
Applicants must submit an additional essay on a topic of their choosing regarding Hellenism. This scholarship has no residency requirement.

Note that unless you are from the greater Metro Atlanta area, your residency status is considered "out of area" regardless of your current address, and with the exceptions noted above (Graduate Nursing & Holy Cross student applications) you are only eligible to apply for the Johnny N. Economy Scholarship.




This year, NHS is sponsoring 100 students to discover their Greek heritage. More than 900 alumni have taken part in this life-changing program, often calling it transformative for both their personal and professional growth.

Criteria for Eligibility (for all programs):

- 18-26 years old and enrolled as an undergraduate/graduate student with a 3.0+ GPA
- A US/Canadian citizen of Hellenic descent*
- Preferably (not mandatory) visiting Greece for the first time

*Hellenic descent is defined as having one or more parents, grandparents, or great grandparents born in Greece or Cyprus. Please note that siblings or first cousins of past and/or current participants, who meet the program's eligibility criteria, may be considered but they must reimburse NHS for all expense related to participation in the *Heritage Greece® Program*
