

The Fall Campaign for 40 Days for Life is 9/27 through 10/5. This is the largest campaign to date with vigils in over 1000 cities and 63 countries. Since the first campaign in 2007, 23,525 lives (that we know of) have been saved, 251 abortion workers quit and 145 abortion centers closed. The Boulder

community has been peacefully praying outside the Boulder abortion clinic since 2008. Our kickoff will be at the Memorial Wall for the Unborn, Sacred Heart of Mary, 6739 South Boulder Road on 10/6 at 5pm. A guest speaker will share the history of the Wall and the lives remembered there. Students will share their experiences at the National Right to Life March in DC. Guidelines for the campaign will be reviewed. Please join us as we Pray to End Abortion.
