A New Age for Confirmation — Cause for Hope

As you may have read last week in the bulletin, or online, Archbishop Coakley and the Secretariat for Evangelization and Catechesis have decided to alter the diocesan standards for confirmation preparation. By 2022, children in the 6th grade will receive this sacrament after a one-year program of preparation.

Is this just an arbitrary change? Does it betray what we believe about confirmation? Why does the Archdiocese think is this better than high-school confirmation?

To be able to answer these questions, it is helpful to understand what Catholics believe about sacraments. The classic definition of a sacrament serves as a starting point: "outward signs of inward grace, instituted by Christ for our sanctification."

Oftentimes, people consider sacraments as only the first two words of the definition: outward signs. Our lives are marked along the way with many of these outward signs. Graduation, induction ceremonies, etc.

But if we simply compare the sacraments to these human moments, we'll start to miss the point. Sacraments give grace to the soul!

I remember coming to Oklahoma and being frustrated with the prevailing view of Confirmation promoted here: the teenager CHOOSES the faith to be his own.

When the weight of sacramental grace is placed on the subject—the person receiving the sacraments—we've lost the battle. It has ramifications in the way we look at our participation in the divine life offered by God, because ultimately, we will be frustrated that we can't reach that divine life by our own willpower.

So I (and many other priests) am overjoyed that children in our Archdiocese will be given the grace of the Holy Spirit to make them witnesses to the love of God earlier in their lives.

Let's continue to pray for a fruitful transition in the way we prepare our youth for the difficult circumstances they face. And never forget the power of your own witness!


