Dear parishioners,

"O Death, where is your sting? O Hell, where is your victory? Christ is risen, and you are overthrown. Christ is risen, and the demons are fallen. Christ is risen, and the angels rejoice. Christ is risen, and life reigns."

The words of St. John Chrysostom give voice to the meaning of our Easter celebration today. We don't celebrate pastel colors and bunnies, colored eggs and glazed hams. We don't celebrate white dresses and pretty lilies. We celebrate the Good News: that with Jesus our sins have been nailed to the cross, and with Jesus, we rise from our death to sin to new life in the love of the Father. Let us celebrate today and this whole week-long as we daily remember the hope that the resurrection offers us!

It's been such a joy to see some of our own church members along with church-goers around the world returning to regular attendance after the disruption COVID has caused for the past two-plus years. If you are returning today, and it's been a while: welcome back! May this Easter season bring you the hope that we all search for. And we hope to see you with us every Sunday as we celebrate this central mystery of our faith: Christ has been raised from the dead and as his brothers and sisters, we have an inheritance in that same resurrection.

St. John Chrysostom also exhorts us on how to celebrate this Easter season: "Wherefore, enter you all into the joy of your Lord; and receive your reward, both the first, and likewise the second. You rich and poor together, hold high festival. You sober and you heedless, honor the day. Rejoice today, both you who have fasted and you who have disregarded the fast. The table is full-laden; feast ye all sumptuously."

May your Easter day be a grace-filled occasion for family and faith, and may God bless you as he breathes new life into our hearts and into the world this spring.
