Almsgiving, Prayer, Fasting, and Temptation

As we begin our season of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, the reading from Deuteronomy reminds us of our duty of almsgiving, that we "set [our offerings] before the Lord, [our] God, [and] shall bow down in [God's] presence" (Deuteronomy 26:10). The reading from Romans refers us to our prayer, reminding us that "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart . . . For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" (Romans 10:8, 13). These are comforting words, and encourage us to ask God for what we need and to aid us in our prayer. Finally, the Gospel of Luke shows us a fasting Jesus, who was tempted as we are, and who knows what it means to be human. Someone once said that temptation arises when you're tired and weary, and the devil comes along and makes a perfectly reasonable suggestion. Parish Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Christ's Passion St. John, Indiana Tuesday, April 9, 2019

8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Join us for a day-long pilgrimage to the *Shrine of Christ's Passion* in Saint John, Indiana. The Shrine is set on thirty acres and contains forty life-size bronze sculptures within gardens that have been created to resemble the Holy Land. Scenes of the Last Supper, the Way of the Cross, the Empty Tomb, and Christ's Ascension, are part of the overall experience. A new addition is a scene with Moses at Mount Sinai. This portion of the shrine has its own path, music, lighting, and voice and sound effects. Overall, the Shrine is a multi-media



experience set within the beauty of the landscape. For those unable to walk the entire property, we can reserve club cars with a tour guide (\$5.00 additional fee per person).

This pilgrimage will be a profound way to prepare for Holy Week, which includes the celebrations of Palm Sunday and The Sacred Triduum (the three days encompassing Holy Thursday sunset to Easter Sunday sunset). Bring your Bible, prayer book, or rosary; or simply allow yourself to become immersed in the beauty of this devotional pilgrimage site.

The day will begin with departure from our parish parking lot at 8:00 a.m. The day will include a video about the history of the Shrine, a formal guided tour allowing you to truly appreciate the scope of this devotional space and property. Pilgrims will also be able to spend time on their own exploring the various paths in order to pray privately. There is also a gift shop on site.

Pro-Life Corner



Deadly Illinois!

Can't believe that the abortion bills in Illinois are all that bad? You're sure that it's just hype, and everything will be fine? Read the HB2495 bill for yourself at http://www.ilga.gov/legislation/101/HB/10100HB2495lv.htm. Then see if you don't agree with this summary: All restrictions on abortion are removed. Only the "pregnant individual" (they removed "mother" and "woman" from the definitions!) can decide (at any age--parental notification is revoked), all abortion statistics are now secret (no FOIA requests), doctors can't be disciplined for abortions on women who aren't even pregnant, and coroners can't investigate deaths at abortion clinics (women or children).

Here are more details directly from the bill:

- D. The state shall not "(2) prosecute ... any individual ... for any act or failure to act during the individual's own pregnancy, if the predominant basis for such prosecution ... is the potential, actual, or perceived impact on the pregnancy or its outcomes" (page 5, lines 2-13) This means that women can no longer be punished willfully or negligently harming their baby by doing drugs, abusing alcohol, or other behavior while pregnant.
- E. "(a) A health care professional may provide abortion ..." (page 6, lines 3-5). Note that a "health care professional" is defined as "including, but not limited to, a physician, advanced practice registered nurse, physician assistant, or person acting under the supervision of one of the above." (page 3, lines 1-4). That means that an abortion can be performed by someone WITH NO TRAINING AT ALL!
- G. "(735 ILCS 5/11-107.1 rep.) Section 905-25. The Code of Civil Procedure is amended by repealing Section 11-107.1." (page 8, lines 11-13). This removes a husband's right to any say in aborting his child.
- H. "(745 ILCS 30/Act rep.) Section 905-30. The Abortion Performance Refusal Act is repealed." (page 8, lines 14-16) Doctors and hospitals—even Catholic ones!—can be sued for not providing or referring for abortions.
- J. "Section 910-20. The Counties Code is amended by changing Section 3-3013 as follows:" (page 49, lines 6-7; page 49, 21-22) Removes the section that says county coroners must investigate "(b) A maternal or fetal death due to abortion..." This means that coroners won't investigate if a woman dies during an abortion--in essence, giving the abortionist final say in what caused the death!!

More to come about the extreme abortion laws in next weeks bulletin.


Unforgettable Memories Community Adult Day Center

Past and Future

In a previous moment in life, I was a high school counselor. Much of my time was spent with young people who were discerning their vocation and possible career opportunities, and selecting colleges or postgraduation programs to continue their education. At times, however, I found myself with a teen who was experiencing difficulty, personally or academically. Not always a crisis, but certainly a time of challenge for the young person. Like all of us, these young people sometimes got stuck — they could not see beyond the present, and everything they experienced was influenced and filtered through the difficulty they faced. As a counselor, I had to help

them reframe their perception — to see the world and their experience differently in order to overcome the obstacles they experienced.

As stewards, we also must reframe our experience at times — we must look for blessing when it feels like there is nothing to celebrate and pay attention differently in order to see and respond to God's grace in our lives. This is one of the key shifts that take place as we commit ourselves to living as disciples and growing as good stewards. Jesus tells us that the kingdom of God is at hand, near to us, here and now. It is easy to miss the grace, the assurance of God's presence, in the

hurried pace of our lives. Yet, as stewards, we learn to take note, to pay attention, and to live accordingly.

During Lent, we are called to metanoia, to essential and radical conversion. We are called to turn away from sin — the failure to see and respond to God's grace — and to turn toward God and God's ways with our lives. We commit ourselves again to deny the selfish, self-centered tendencies within us, take up our crosses, and follow Jesus. What experience do you need to reframe in order to see the blessings and grace in your life? What are you called to deny? What cross must you take up? How will your observance of Lent help you to grow as a disciple and live as a steward now and in the future?

Fasting is Good for Christian Stewards

Many who are serious about using the season of Lent for spiritual preparation find that the discipline of fasting helps them in a number of ways. Three reasons to fast during Lent come quickly to mind:

Fasting increases our sense of gratitude.

We celebrate the blessing of food as coming from the Lord. Our denial of food for a time serves to keep us all the more aware of this essential gift. Moreover, how can we not be grateful when we end our fast? Tasting food again serves to celebrate our discipline, persistence and commitment to prayer during a fast.

Fasting speeds up our journey to self-discovery.

We are creatures of habit, and eating is a habit. When we fast, it jostles our daily routine. It messes up our schedule. This becomes a perfect time to reflect on our routines and how we want our lives to move forward in a positive manner. Take time ordinarily spent on eating to write a reflection, meditate or engage in some other form of reflection.

Fasting helps condition us to meet our spiritual goals.

How many times do we set goals and fail to meet them? The habit of fasting will help us set a goal and exercise control over a habit in order to meet that goal. The discipline of fasting encourages us to see that we can attain our goals and helps condition us to succeed at the next goal we set. Catholics are called to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and during the Fridays in Lent. Additionally, we are asked to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting consists of one full meatless meal and other limited meatless meals as required to maintain strength. The young, the elderly and those with health issues are not required to fast. The discipline of fasting and abstinence should always be approached in a spirit of prayer and with the goal of making a sacrifice in order to draw closer to the Lord.

HISTORY OF ST. JOSEPH ALTAR

Sicily, the largest and most populous of the Mediterranean Islands, because of its location in the north central Mediterranean Sea, has often been used as a "stepping stone" to and from the European continent.

In the ninth century, agriculture and commerce flourished by cultivating mountainous land. Grapes, olives, wheat, and citrus were the main crops and chief exports. For too long there had

been no rain to nourish the crops that sustained life for the Island. The dried out crops cracked beneath the feet of the poor farmers as they walked through their barren fields. Only a sea of dust and withered vines remained from what had once been row upon row of brightly colored fruits, vegetables, and wheat. And so the people prayed to their patron, St. Joseph, for relief from the terrible famine that gripped the Island. At last the skies opened, sending down the life -giving water, and the people rejoiced.

For their gratitude, they prepared tables of an assortment of foods they had harvested. After paying honor to St. Joseph, they celebrated together and also distributed food to the less fortunate.
