Diocese of Joliet Announces Appointment of New Bishop, Most Reverend Ronald A. Hicks

July 17, 2020

JOLIET, IL-- Pope Francis today announced that he has named Bishop Ronald A. Hicks, Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Chicago, as the sixth Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Joliet, IL. Pope Francis had previously accepted the resignation of Bishop Emeritus R. Daniel Conlon and had named Bishop Richard E. Pates as Apostolic Administrator of the diocese until a new bishop could be appointed.



Bishop Hicks, 52, will be installed at the Cathedral of St. Raymond Nonnatus in Joliet, Illinois on September 29, 2020.

"The Diocese of Joliet is most grateful to Pope Francis for the appointment of Bishop Ronald Hicks as its sixth bishop," said Bishop Pates. "The bishop owns a reputation for pastoral leadership and is totally committed to the ongoing renewal of the Catholic Church. He is a worthy successor to Bishop Conlon and his predecessors."

About Bishop Hicks

Bishop Hicks, a native of Harvey, IL. grew up in South Holland, IL. where he attended St. Jude the Apostle Parish and Grade School. He graduated from Quigley Seminary South in 1985. He received his B.A. in Philosophy from Niles College of Loyola University Chicago in 1989 and his Master of Divinity degree in 1994 and his Doctor of Ministry degree in 2003, both from the University of St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein, Illinois.

Bishop Hicks served as an Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Mercy Parish in Chicago from 1994 to 1996 and then at St. Elizabeth Seton Parish in Orland Hills, Illinois. from 1996 to 1999. From 1999 to 2005, he lived and ministered at St. Joseph College Seminary as the Dean of Formation.

In July 2005, with permission from Cardinal Francis George, Bishop Hicks moved from Chicago to El Salvador to begin his five-year term as Regional Director of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) in Central America. NPH is a home dedicated to caring for more than 3,400 orphaned and abandoned children in nine Latin American and Caribbean countries.

From 2010 to 2014, Bishop Hicks served as the Dean of Formation at Mundelein Seminary. During that time, he assisted with weekend Masses at St. Jerome Parish in Rogers Park, Chicago, Ill.

Bishop Hicks was appointed Vicar General of the Archdiocese by Cardinal Cupich on January 1, 2015. On September 17, 2018 he was ordained an Auxiliary Bishop at Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago.

THE RICHES OF THE WORD OF GOD

In the Lectionary readings, proclaimed at Sunday and weekday Masses, we find a wealth of inspiring Good News, for God himself is its Author. Were he not, would it be at all accurate to refer to the scriptures as God's Word? No, the scriptures would be the work of a series of merely human authors over many hundreds of years. The Holy Spirit, as the Church teaches, is the Divine Author. Having worked through each human author in such a way that only what he desired to impart to all generations would be made known, the Church recognizes the great treasure received in the written Word of God. The Holy Spirit's abiding presence in the Church guided the Fathers of the early Church individually and collectively in decisive Church councils to determine the final number of books that make up the old and new testaments. This was not a matter of some kind of "divine dictation" whereby the human involvement is in any way less than completely free. From Moses, author of the Pentateuch (i.e., the old testament books of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy) and the prophets, to the four Gospels and letters of Sts. Peter, Paul, James, John and others, all of these authors exercised a cooperation with the will of God that completely respected their free will. Simultaneously these human authors chose to exercise that very will by seeking God's will in what they wrote, and in what they left out, for that matter. We too, must seek God's will humbly, as we seek to know what he wants us to do in order to keep his commands and serve him unreservedly. The hearing of the Word of God, especially in the celebration of the Mass, must not be passive. The message of God's Word is for the whole world and for you and me, to the very depths of our souls. Pray that more and more of God's holy Word will find a welcome home there, putting down deep, deep roots to fortify our faith with knowledge. Knowledge of how God has acted in the past, tells us about him and tells us about our need for him, and how we can find him. Consider the prophet Isaiah, who announces an invitation and a warning. The message of Isaiah is open to either interpretation. Isaiah says: "Seek the Lord while he may be found, call to him while he is still near" (Isaiah 55:6). To those who humbly and sincerely seek the Lord, this is an invitation. To those who ignore the grace of God which seeks to inspire them to seek him, these same words contain an implicit warning: Seek the Lord now, while he may be found. Don't put it off. For there may come a day when he can no longer be found. Call to the Lord while he is near, for there may come a day when he will no longer be near. The choice is ours. We have God's Word on that.



MARRIAGE

Ultimately, same-sex marriage is only one symptom of a broader change in how marriage is viewed—its purpose regarding children, the understanding of monogamy and the value of its permanence. For the sake of the common good, Catholics must not give up the struggle in defense of traditional marriage. For the sake of sacramental marriage, the Church must mobilize its resources for a much broader catechesis as it prepares those who remain in its fold to be a minority once again — strangers in a strange land.

Stewardship



This time of uncertainty really has our personal "worlds" turned upside down. Schedules are no longer the same. Planning has gone awry. Calendars look like a mess. And the rhythm of our days has met a new "abnormal." Many of us have neither the time nor the resources for a vacation, but all of us can resonate with the need to really "get away" from the stress of our daily grind. Good stewardship of our bodies, minds and souls obliges us to get away on a regular basis (see Luke 5:16).

As Christian stewards, we aren't just encouraged but obligated to consider how we approach our stewardship of leisure time. Stewards are aware of their need to be busy doing God's work, but often forget that down time is equally important to spiritual growth. Leisure time, whether it's our evenings, our weekends, or our vacation, provides spiritual, physical, mental and emotional recharging. Leisure is necessary for human wholeness. Leisure reconnects us to the wider mysteries of our world and our God. It helps us daydream, imagine, pray. It refreshes our spirit.

July offers an opportunity to reconnect with the rhythms of God and nature.

Today, connectivity has become almost an obsession. People check their emails, their messages and calls with alarming repetitiveness. Accidents, both pedestrian and automobile, happen because people can't put down their phones. Employers expect their workers to be available for evening emails. The lines between work and free time increasingly blur, as do the lines between solitude and always being present "online." We can't imagine putting aside screens for a two-week vacation. But we must give ourselves time to renew and recharge, not just two weeks of the year, but each day and each week.

July offers an opportunity to reconnect with the rhythms of God and nature. We need to take time off from screens and phones, and practice giving undivided attention to the things before us. When we pray, we commit time and silence. When we enjoy time with our friends and family, we practice being totally present. When we sit on the patio or at the beach, we give ourselves wholly to the wind or the waves. Be a good steward of your body, mind and soul. Don't overschedule your time off. Listen to the quiet whisper of God encouraging you to relax.
