from the Pastor

ALL HALLOW'S EVE

Halloween is a great excuse for a good time, especially for children! I do hope that their parents and religion teachers help them to learn of the strong connection that existed, at least historically, between Halloween and the next day, All Saints Day. The very word 'Halloween' is a shortened form of 'All Hallow's Eve'. Who are the hallowed ones? Why all God's Saints! The Saints of the Church are not only those honored throughout the year with a feast day on the calendar. There are, to be sure, saints known only to God. There are also saints without the formal recognition of the Church via canonization, but who are clearly recognized as holy by those who knew them. Beloved members of your own family and our parish family, too, are included in the ranks of the saints.

All Hallow's Eve developed in the Church as a response to various superstitious beliefs and practices surrounding death. No, October 31 is not "the night of the living dead". That's Hollywood presenting fiction dressed in a really convincing costume that looks like fact. For Catholic children, the true nature of both Halloween and All Saint's Day is best brought to their attention by the once common practice of dressing up as one's favorite Saint. Something to think about as the family celebrates Halloween. It also reminds the children that All Saints Day is a holy day.



FOR ALL THE SAINTS..... OUR COMMUNION WITH THEM

On the Solemnity of All Saints (Sunday, November 1) the teaching of the Church on "the communion of saints" as presented in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (C.C.C.) reminds us of our connection to the triumphant members of the family of God. Their triumph is over sin and death by the grace of him who is the Firstborn among the dead, Jesus Christ. On the communion of saints the catechism teaches:

After confessing "the holy Catholic Church," the Apostles' Creed adds "the communion of saints." In a certain sense this article (of the Creed) is a further explanation of the preceding: "What is the Church if not the assembly of all the saints?" The communion of saints is the Church (C.C.C. #946).

"Since all the faithful form one body, the good of each is communicated to the others.... We must, therefore, believe that there exists a communion of goods in the Church. But the most important member is Christ, since he is the head... Therefore, the riches of Christ are communicated to all the members, through the sacraments." "As this church is governed by one and the same Spirit, all the goods she has received necessarily become a common fund" (C.C.C. #947).

The term "communion of saints" therefore has two closely linked meanings: communion "in holy things (sancta)" and "among holy persons (sancti)".

Sancta sanctis! ("God's holy gifts for God's holy people") is proclaimed by the celebrant in most Eastern Liturgies during the elevation of the holy Gifts before the distribution of communion. The faithful (sancti) are fed by Christ's holy body and blood (sancta) to grow in the communion of the Holy Spirit (koinonia) and to communicate it to the world (C.C.C. 948).



Contemplative Prayer Group Meditation in the Christian Tradition

Resuming via ZOOM

Wednesdays, 1:00—2:00 pm

Be still and know that I am God (Psalm 46:10).

The person who practices meditation in the Christian tradition – praying in silence and stillness - seeks to be present and open to God who is always present and open to his beloved. Practicing meditation enables us - with the grace of God - to be present and open to each moment, to others in daily life, and to God's presence in all of life.

Many people practice various forms of meditative prayer such as *Lectio Divina* (Sacred Reading), Centering Prayer, the Jesus Prayer, Christian Meditation, or the Prayer of Recollection of Saint Teresa of Avila. Whatever practice engaged during the prayer period, it is important to remember that any form of meditation or contemplation in the Christian tradition complements our other forms of prayer. It does not replace them.

This ongoing weekly gathering group is intended for adults to pray communally with other adults in silent meditation, and to receive mutual encouragement and support in their own contemplative practice. We meet Wednesday afternoons from 1:00 until 2:00 pm. During the current period, as we live with the pandemic, we will not meet in person, but via ZOOM, a free app for online groups.

Each session begins with a welcome followed by a time of formation (an appropriate reading) to help prepare and guide us to a twenty-minute period of meditation. After the meditation period, a brief time in discussion helps to integrate and reflect on the experience. You may wish to participate each week, or when you are able. Contact Bob Valle at bvalle@sjpdg.org for more information and be placed on an email reminder list. You will receive a Meeting ID number and a passcode to enter the online group.


