from the Pastor

Mystery of Faith

Mysterium Fidei, (Mystery of Faith) is the title of an encyclical letter of Pope Paul VI published on September 3, 1965. It is on the doctrine and worship of the Holy Eucharist. There is a wealth of splendid papal teaching in this document. Church teaching, because it is rooted deeply in Christ's own divine teaching, serves to deepen the knowledge of all the members of the Church. Such teaching is never something entirely new, but rather a development of that which has always been believed. It may have, for a time, remained hidden from the Church's understanding, but, ever aware of the Holy Spirit's help, the Church acquires, in succeeding ages, a deeper understanding of the mysteries of our faith and so also a more fruitful articulation of them.



In his *Catechism On the Real Presence*, the late Father John A. Hardon, S.J., explores the full implications of Pope Paul's *Mysterium Fidei* by way of a Q. & A. format. In the whole of the document, Pope Paul VI has taught the Church about the growth of worship of the Eucharist in the Mass and outside of it as well. Fr. Hardon poses these two questions, basing his answers on the teaching found in *Mysterium Fidei (MF)*. How valuable is conversation with Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist? A.) Pope Paul VI assures us that "there is nothing more consoling on earth, nothing more efficacious for advancing along the road to holiness." The reason is obvious. Christ, in the Blessed

Sacrament, is the **same** Jesus who gave courage to His contemporaries during His visible life in Palestine. He is the **same** Jesus who performed miracles, not only in healing human bodies, but even raising people from the dead. He also performs miracles of moral conversion and sanctification **now** through the Holy Eucharist, provided we believe (MF#80). Another question: How is the Eucharist the spiritual center of the Catholic Church? A.) The Holy Eucharist, reserved in the churches and oratories, is the spiritual center of a parish, a diocese, religious community, of the Universal Church, and of the whole human race. **Why?** Because under the appearance of what *looks* like bread is contained Jesus Christ, the Redeemer of the world, "by whom all things are and by whom we exist" (MF#181). For these reasons our diocese and our parish promotes and makes available opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration. Join us for Eucharistic Adoration every Monday evening from 6:00 to 9:00 pm in the chapel. Come, let us adore Him.







Contemplative Prayer Group Meditation in the Christian Tradition

Resuming via ZOOM Wednesdays, 1:00—2:00 pm

Be still and know that I am God (Psalm 46:10).

The person who practices meditation in the Christian tradition – praying in silence and stillness - seeks to be present and open to God who is always present and open to his beloved. Practicing meditation enables us - with the grace of God - to be present and open to each moment, to others in daily life, and to God's presence in all of life.

Many people practice various forms of meditative prayer such as *Lectio Divina* (Sacred Reading), Centering Prayer, the Jesus Prayer, Christian Meditation, or the Prayer of Recollection of Saint Teresa of Avila. Whatever practice engaged during the prayer period, it is important to remember that any form of meditation or contemplation in the Christian tradition complements our other forms of prayer. It does not replace them.

This ongoing weekly gathering group is intended for adults to pray communally with other adults in silent meditation and to receive mutual encouragement and support in their own contemplative practice. We meet Wednesday afternoons from 1:00 until 2:00 pm. During the current period, as we live with the pandemic, we will not meet in person but via ZOOM, a free app for online groups.

Each session begins with a welcome followed by a time of formation (an appropriate reading) to help prepare and guide us to a twenty-minute period of meditation. After the meditation period, a brief time in discussion helps to integrate and reflect on the experience. You may wish to participate each week or when you are able.
