Encouragement Beyond Our Imagining... And Not a Minute Too Soon

"Master, it is good that we are here!" (MT 17:4). These are the first words Peter speaks in response to the glory of the Lord revealed ever so briefly on Mount Tabor. Peter, James and John are chosen by Jesus to follow him up this high mountain, away from the others. Six days earlier the Apostles were shocked and saddened by Jesus' announcement at Caesarea Philippi that he was going to Jerusalem to suffer and die at the hands of the chief priests, the elders and the Scribes. Further, they did not know what the Lord meant when he spoke of rising from the dead. With such perplexing news still very much on their minds, Peter, James and John are about to receive encouragement beyond their imagining. In the Transfiguration of Jesus, prominently between Moses and Elijah, is a glimpse of God's glory, a sneak preview of heaven that brought the Apostles into a state of immense happiness. This mountaintop experience of the Lord Jesus, "the beloved Son in whom the Father is well pleased" (cf. LK 9:36), would remain in their hearts the rest of their days. There were dark days on the horizon. The Apostles would witness the betraying kiss of Judas and Peter would deny ever knowing Jesus. Jesus was falsely arrested, tried and condemned. Exactly as he foretold at Caesarea Philippi.

Pope Leo the Great says that: "The principal aim of the Transfiguration was to banish from the disciples' souls the scandal of the Cross. St. Bede, commenting on today's passage of the Gospel, says that Our Lord, in a loving concession, allowed Peter, James and John to enjoy for a very short time the contemplation of the happiness that lasts forever, so as to enable them to bear adversity with greater fortitude" (From: In Conversation with God, Vol. II, pp 67-69).

We, too, can draw strength even from simply taking in these events as described in the Gospel. But the inspired Word of God also yields further insights for those who read it with and in the Church. That is, as we pray for an increase of faith and the help of the Holy Spirit while meditating on sacred scripture we can have our own visit to the mountain top. Like Peter, we'll want to stay longer, too. These are days when we seek encouragement and strength for what lies ahead. No matter what happens, our God reigns. For now, the glory and everlasting joy of heaven are hidden from us. So too, the divine nature of Jesus was ordinarily hidden, veiled in human flesh, the Transfiguration being the one exception. Things may get worse before they get better. Lent is about adopting the practices which require a self-discipline for our own good. It is God who has first authority over us in the matter of the necessity of discipline from him, and secondarily from one's parents while we are young and in their care. The Letter to the Hebrews explains:

In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. Quoting from Proverbs 3:11-12, Hebrews continues: "My son do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor lose courage when you are punished by him. For the Lord disciplines him whom he loves." It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline? Strive for peace with all men, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord (Hebrews 12:4-7, 14). May the hope inspired by Jesus' transfiguration lead us to the joy of Easter as we embrace the disciplines of Lent.




History of St. Joseph Altar and Table

Sicily the largest and most populous of the Mediterranean Islands, because of its location in the north central Mediterranean Sea, has often been used as a “stepping stone” to and from the European continent. In the ninth century, agriculture and commerce flourished by cultivating mountainous land. Grapes, olives, wheat, and citrus were the main crops and chief exports.

For too long there had been no rain to nourish the crops that sustained life for the Island. The dried out crops cracked beneath the feet of the poor farmers as they walked through their barren fields. Only a sea of dust and withered vines remained from what had once been row upon row of brightly colored fruits, vegetables, and wheat.

And so the people prayed to their patron, St. Joseph, for relief from the terrible famine that gripped the Island. At last the skies opened, sending down the life-giving water, and the people rejoiced. For their gratitude, they prepared tables of an assortment of foods they had harvested. After paying honor to St. Joseph, they celebrated together and also distributed food to the less fortunate.

Whether a St. Joseph Altar is displayed at an elegant church or a humble table, it is a reflection of deep devotion to St. Joseph, the patron of those in need ~ workers, the poor, the aged, the dying.
