
Your Gift to the CMAA Makes a Difference







It's February. That means at least one aisle of every grocery store is covered in all things red and pink! It's the time of year to talk about candy and chocolate. That four letter 'l' word is in the air. Lent. Yes, that's right—Lent. So, hurry up and finish off the contents of that heart shaped box of chocolates before you "give it up." But thinking about Lent should not make you stop thinking about love. Lent is a season of love. The focus of these forty days is sacrifice—prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It is easy to think of these things as negative when we focus on them from our own point of view. They all involve not doing something for ourselves. But, if we look at them from an external point of view, they are all ways in which we are doing something for someone else—for God or for our brothers and



sisters in Christ. These small acts have a much greater effect than anything we could do for ourselves in their place. Throughout Lent, God is preparing to do something very special for us to show us how much he loves us. He is preparing to make the ultimate sacrifice. How are you planning to show God you love him? When Jesus opens his arms on Good Friday, will you be ready to run and embrace him and say "I love you" in return?




