



This Lent, consider a Lenten Sacrifice focused on Care for God's Creation




Why a Lenten Creation Care Fast? Plastic waste is clogging landfills and waterways, disrupting ecosystems & poisoning food chains.

Plastic takes centuries to degrade and breaks down into smaller pieces that harm wildlife when mistaken by animals for food.
