



Prayer in the Spirit of the Taizé Community Returns to Saint Joseph

Sundays: October 15, November 19, and December 17 7:00 p.m.



"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you."

(John 14: 27)

For several years, parishioners, Catholics from other parishes, and fellow Christians from other communities have gathered at Saint Joseph Church to pray for peace and reconciliation within our households, within our communities, and within our world. We do this by coming together singing simple songs and chants, entering into silence, opening ourselves to the Lord's presence, and drawing closer to the heart of God. This prayer is modeled on the daily prayer of the Taizé Community in France, an ecumenical monastic community founded by Brother Roger Schutz in the 1940s, whose very existence "is a 'parable of community' that wants its life to be a sign of reconciliation between divided Christians and between separated peoples."

Though you may not be familiar with the prayer, you will be most familiar with the simple songs that are part of the ritual. "Jesus, Remember Me," "Bless the Lord," and "Eat This Bread" are just a few of the songs that are part of our Sunday worship; these and many more were composed so that people could be drawn closer to an awareness of God's presence through repetitive prayers. Think of the repeated rhythms of the rosary, or if you practice meditation, the repeated word or phrase that keeps one grounded in intention. The prayer also encompasses a service of light, the reading of Scripture, and a period of communal silence. In many parishes that offer this prayer, families bring their children to form them in devotional prayer and to instill a practice that is easily joined to one's spirit. Young adults, for whom the brothers of Taizé have a special ministry, are also drawn to its beauty.

Our world is too familiar with war; our cities and neighborhoods struggle with violence; our politics engage aggressive rhetoric instead of dialogue; and even our households may be in need of compassionate acts of reconciliation and love. The faith-filled community that has gathered to pray in the spirit of the Taizé community is a witness among those who gather for the prayer; it is a time and place where the seeds of peace and justice may be sown in our hearts. And it also witnesses beyond the time of prayer when it slowly changes our own hearts and forms us in the spirit of Christ who came through closed doors after his resurrection and said, "Peace be with you."

Little by little, this intentional community of prayer grows, and your presence can help it to flourish! Bring your families, your children, and anyone who may need to share in a time of prayer, song, and silence that opens us up to the spirit of Christ's peace and unity.

Anointing of the Sick at all Sunday Masses October 21 and 22

The Lord himself showed great concern for the bodily and spiritual welfare of the sick and commanded his followers to do likewise. This is clear from the gospels, and above all from the existence of the sacrament of anointing, which he instituted and which is made know in the Letter of James. Since then the Church has never ceased to celebrate this sacrament for its members by the anointing and the prayer of its priests, commending those who are ill to the suffering and glorified Lord, that he may raise them up and save them (see James 5: 14-16).

(Pastoral Care of the Sick, 5)

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is intended for those whose health is seriously impaired by physical or mental illness, old age, as well as those preparing for serious surgery or enduring a serious chronic illness. Children may also be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by the sacrament. We, as members of the Church baptized into the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ, support the sick in their struggle against illness and we continue Christ's own mission of healing.

It is especially fitting that all baptized Christians share in this ministry of mutual charity within the Body of Christ by doing all that they can to help the sick return to health, by showing love for the sick, and by celebrating the sacraments with them. Like other sacraments, these too have a community aspect, which should be brought out as much as possible when they are celebrated.

(Pastoral Care of the Sick, 33)

If you, a member of your family, a friend, or a parishioner near you should receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, please come to one of the Sunday Masses on October 21 and 22.

We will pray as a community knowing that when one of us suffers, we all suffer. We will share in a prayer of faith asking God's help for those who are ill. During the laying on of hands the sick will know that they are the focus of the Church's prayer. Through the anointing with oil, all present will know that the Spirit's healing, strengthening presence is in this person and in this community.

Please also remember that whenever you or a member of your family are in need of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, you may contact the parish to schedule a time for our parish priest to visit at your home or in the hospital to celebrate the sacrament.

May the healing touch of Christ through our presence and participation in the communal celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick be present for all enduring illness.


