

Gratitude, Generosity and Stewardship





Church Air Conditioning Replacement

I share with our parish community the announcement of an important and large capital improvement that we need to make here at St. Joseph Parish and the need to raise the funds necessary for replacement of our aging air conditioning system in the Church.

As you may know, over the past couple years we have experienced numerous problems with our 31 year old HVAC system in our church. The last major issue was this past and very hot Easter Sunday, when 2 of the 5 air conditioning units crashed and left us with limited air conditioning in the church. We were able to have the needed repairs made. However, it has become clear that the present church air conditioning system is unstable and that any future repairs made would be nothing more than postponing its inevitable replacement. As the original system was installed in 1992, most of the equipment is at or far beyond its expected life. The increasing costs to maintain the current system, its reduced efficiency, and the difficulty and increasing expense to find and purchase the replacement parts, if they are available at all, have led us to conclude that we are in need of a new system.

Nothing is easy with old buildings! Air conditioning is no longer considered a luxury - it is a necessity! For this reason I come to you, our faithful, faith-filled parishioners to help me in meeting this challenge. I find asking for money one of the most difficult duties of my priesthood, but I have no other choice. As this project will be quite expensive, we have chosen Giving Tuesday to raise the funds needed to ensure we can enjoy reliable, energy-efficient comfort for many years into the future! I am most grateful for whatever you can do to help defray this extraordinary expense. Please be assured of my prayers for your sacrifice.






