

Creation Care Corner



Lent—A Time for Change

Consider positive lifestyle changes during Lent. The US Bishops tell us we are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. One area where the world could benefit from personal conversion is what Pope John Paul II called an "ecological conversion." This is a conversion "... whereby the effects of their encounter with Jesus Christ become evident in their relationship with the world around them" (LS 217).

In Laudate Deum, Pope Francis encourages us to modify lifestyles to reduce pollution and waste, and to "consume with prudence." Even though these everyday actions will not produce an immediate, notable effect on climate change, "we are helping to bring about large processes of transformation" and a new culture of care. Francis tells us to "put an end to the irresponsible derision that would present this issue as something purely ecological, 'green,' romantic, frequently subject to ridicule by economic interests," he wrote. "Let us finally admit that it is a human and social problem on any number of levels."

Bom in 1287 in northern Italy to rich and powerful nobles, Margaret's birth was met with her parents' disgust and rejection, as she was born with numerous deformities. Eventually, out of fear of her discovery, Margaret's parents confined her to a cell connected to a church. It was here in the solitude of the mountains that she formed a profound and intimate relationship with God. She was later abandoned by her parents and left to fend for herself in a strange city. She would be taken in by beggars and then by various families. However, her holiness and deep love of God inspired and changed the hearts of those she encountered. She become a lay Dominican and served the sick and the imprisoned until her death at the age of thirtythree.


