



#### **Considering Carbon Fasting**

Fasting in ways that reduce earth warming carbon emissions is a contemporary Christian way to celebrate Lent. Weather patterns are already changing. We are approaching tipping points that could cause severe ecological disruption creating misery for the poor and future generations. "Lent should be a time for prayer and fasting to stop climate change. It is an act of penance for what we in the rich world have done, and it is a prayer for help in avoiding catastrophe."

Stop eating or reduce meat consumption, especially beef, during Lent. Beef consumption produces huge amounts of greenhouse gases and contributes to deforestation. Reduce and consolidate your auto trips and use public transportation where possible. Reduce heating and air conditioning usage. 



Bom in 1287 in northern Italy to rich and powerful nobles, Margaret's birth was met with her parents' disgust and rejection, as she was born with numerous deformities. Eventually, out of fear of her discovery, Margaret's parents confined her to a cell connected to a church. It was here in the solitude of the mountains that she formed a profound and intimate relationship with God. She was later abandoned by her parents and left to fend for herself in a strange city. She would be taken in by beggars and then by various families. However, her holiness and deep love of God inspired and changed the hearts of those she encountered. She become a lay Dominican and served the sick and the imprisoned until her death at the age of thirtythree.

Come on your own, with a friend, or bring the whole family! We look forward to celebrating with you.


