23rd Sunday Reflection

On this Sunday you are invited to reflect on the radical demands of an authentic Christian faith. The Scriptural verse: "Christ died for all, that those who live might live no longer for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised," (2Cor 5:15) reminds us of the challenge we as Christians are faced with.

The Gospel Reading has Jesus shocking us by using a hyperbole, that of "hate" to show no one else, including one's family, is to be preferred to him. It has been said, one cannot be for Christ on Sunday and against Him for the remainder of the week. Being true followers of Jesus implies living our Christian faith day in and day out. After all, if Jesus is there to give himself totally to us, ought we not to do our best in responding to his call as best as we can?

While this may not necessarily be giving up all one's possessions literally, as the Gospel places before us, we need to discern the specificity of what Christ's call to us might mean. It may mean taking off the desire to have more comforts, or pride, laziness etc. and putting on humility or taking time to assist someone in need or making time for prayer in one's daily scheme of things.

The author of today's first reading affirms the difficulty in learning the counsel of God or discerning his particular will because of our limited understanding. However, one need not despair because as Jesus, himself had promised his disciples that Holy Spirit would lead them to all truth. In desiring God, we are provided for all that is required for our contentment. "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well." (Matt 6:33).
