"Passed from Death to a New Life"

Our gospel reading today describes how the apostles came to believe that Christ had risen and entered into God's glory. Their journey of faith is the journey we must also travel, and death does not scare us any more. We believe that through Christ's death we have conversion, forgiveness of sins and new life.

What is needed from us is our **faith**. Sometimes **doubts** click into our minds as to question ourselves, for instance, on why Jesus never appeared to the chief priest, to Pilate, to the soldiers who crucified him to tell them: "Here I am, alive!" Would it not have the best way to remove all doubts?

But God does nothing of this kind because faith is incompatible with these "proofs" and "demonstrations." We can not say: I believe that the sun exists, because we see it's light and feel it's heat. Faith is not a surrender to evidence; it is a free answer to a call. There are always very good reasons to refuse it, and the fact that there are atheists is proof that God always acts gently, does not impose, uses no violence.

The spiritual journey of the apostles towards faith is the image of what each one of us has to go through. We too pass through many doubts, uncertainties and fears before we can "see" the Risen Lord (differently but not less really). Every time we gather together in prayer, every time we listen to his word, he is among us. Little by little our eyes open up, and we discover that if we die with him, we will enter with him into the full life of God!

And so the surest ways of experiencing Jesus are: prayerful reading of the scriptures, meaningful celebration of the Eucharist and loving service.

However, parishes are still required to limit Mass attendance to capacity limits according to Risk Level per each county in Oregon. Pastors and parishes are simply required to ensure maximum numbers allowed are not exceeded at any given faith gathering. For many of our parishes, this change will still mean some kind of reservation system for Masses. Door monitors/hospitality ministers will still be needed to ensure masking, distancing and cleaning protocols are followed and maximum number are not exceeded. *St. Boniface Church has increased to 80 people maximum and 25 in Parish hall.


80 people: Weekday Mass: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday & Friday 7 am.





In Memoriam: Please keep **Sr. Mary Joyce Barsotti, SSMO** in your prayers. Sr. Joyce passed away on April 12, 2021 at the motherhouse convent. There was a vigil service on Thursday, April 15, and a funeral Mass on Friday, April 16, both at the motherhouse chapel in Beaverton.

Sr. Joyce begun her 24 years of Catholic education ministry at Sacred Heart School, (Tillamook), and served at St. Cecilia in Beaverton, St. Boniface in Sublimity, St. Mary's in Spokane, and St. Mary's in Stayton. Sr. Joyce then ministered to adults for 25 years, as pastoral associate at St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Salem, she worked with parish education and activities. She also assisted with parish adult religious education when living in Beaverton. A woan of prayer, simplicity, love, and compassion, Sr. Joyce served 10 years in information work with new SSMO members and in her work as a leadership team member, 2010-2015.

Sr. Joyce had an expertise and passion for sacred liturgy. She served on the steering committee for the annual Family Summer Conference at Mount Angel for 34 years, during 27 of those years she had responsibility for liturgy. Working in parishes in Salem and Beaverton for over 15 years, Sr. Joyce developed and extended the Liturgy of the Word for children. Spreading God's Word was the goal of her work with the SSMO-sponsored Bethany Center presentations Sr. Joyce worked to unite people in the best ways: Sacred Liturgy and her great, homemade Italian food.

One of Sr. Joyce's favorite quotations was from Irenaeus: "The glory of God is humanity fully alive!"

Her trust was in the Lord's assurance: "I have come that you may have life, and have it to the full!"
