"The One who heals the Lepers is Now among Us"

A saying at the time of Jesus stated: "There are four categories of persons that are just like dead people: the poor, the leper, the blind and the childless." The leper could not come near villages, and the place where they lived was considered unclean and impure, like the cemeteries. Some rabbis openly declared that if ever they met a leper they would throw stones at him shouting: "Go back to your place! Don't contaminate other people!" Every disease is looked on as punishment for one's sins, but leprosy is the very symbol of sin. It was thought that God used it to punish mainly the envious, the arrogant, the thieves, the murderers and so forth. To be cured from leprosy was a miracle comparable to reviving a dead: only God could work such a miracle, but only after the expiation of the sins that had caused it, of course. The lepers were thus rejected by all people! This is how society dealt with them, and we can thus understand why the ten lepers we find in the gospel of today, stop at a distance and cry aloud: "Jesus! Master! Take pity on us!" They are not asking to be healed, they only want him to show compassion and sympathy for their desperate condition. The ten lepers thus represent the totality of one people: Israel, or the whole humankind. And leprosy represent the state of sin, it is the symbol of sin, of human misery, of separation from God and from the people. Therefore, as people of God we all need to meet with Jesus. None of us is upright, none of us is exempt from leprosy, we are all seeking the salvation of the Lord.




