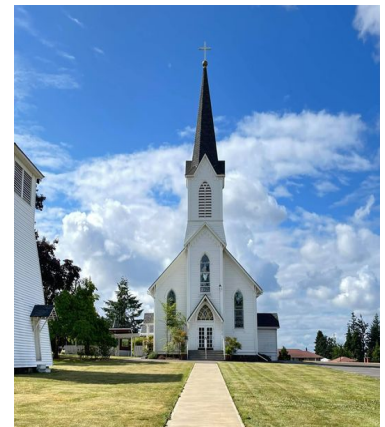
"Happy People Live the Beatitudes"

Paul in today's second reading situates the meaning of the beatitudes thus: "God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong..." (1 Cor 1:27). The beatitudes of Jesus present us a system of values and standards contrary to that of the world. Happiness according to the world is measured by wealth, power and success. But for Jesus it is poverty of spirit, meekness, gentleness, mercy, working for peace, and suffering for justice and righteousness. The reward for those who live the beatitudes is great in heaven. Jesus, in his earthly life, put these values into practice and showed us how one can follow this path and reach the ultimate happiness of heaven. Being poor, meek, gentle and suffering persecution are not signs of weakness but of strength for those who trust in the power of God who is the source of all strength. It is his power that brings us ultimate happiness. The worldly standards of happiness will pass away. "The beatitudes are a call to us to see ourselves, to live with ourselves, in a way that probably does not come easily to most of us!" And so, because not one of the beatitudes is a commandment, we do well to tell ourselves, "Become like Jesus. Become single-hearted. Center your whole life on God." That would be good advice to give ourselves. In following it we will be able to fulfill the one thing which today Jesus tells us to do: "Be glad and rejoice for your reward in heaven is great."

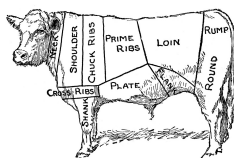

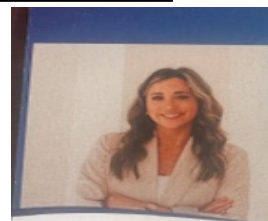
