"The Christian is Salt and Light"

The theme of the Sunday is contained in the two parables of the Gospel. The figure of light is given more importance than that of the salt and, in fact, the first reading refers also to the theme of light. The second reading is related to this theme because Paul states that the good works are the sign of the presence of the spirit. They are the visible, concrete and physical proofs of the truth of the doctrine proclaimed by the Christians. Thus, by declaring that the disciples are the salt of the earth and the light of the world Jesus is placing on their shoulders great responsibility for the salvation of the world. As Christians we are to be the element that purifies, preserves and gives taste to life. We are to saturate our human society with the values of the Gospel. Our presence in the world cannot be private and hidden. 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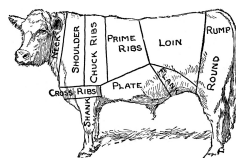
