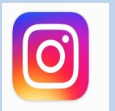

We are into January and I wanted to share an idea I came across a few years ago ~ adopting a Patron Saint for your family! I love this idea because it exposes your family to more saints to learn about; it gives you someone to emulate for the year who loved and lived for Jesus; and it provides a new saint feast day to celebrate and learn the traditions that go along with that saint.

You can decide on your family's Patron Saint together. Think about the needs your family has right now. Perhaps you are beginning to Home School your children ~ try Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton or St. Thomas Aquinas; or perhaps a new baby will be entering into your family this year ~ perhaps ask St. Philomena, St. Gianna, St. Raymond, St. Joseph, St. Gerard, or St. Brigit to intercede for you; or maybe your family needs extra prayers due to illness or a desperate cause, call on St. Jude or our Blessed Mother.

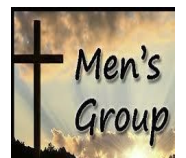
