

Migrant Ministry 2024

Collections: May 25 - June 9



Each year since 2003, the four Catholic parishes in the Roanoke Valley collect basic necessities needed for **2,000**+ documented migrants living in **7** camps and working in the fields along Virginia's Eastern Shore during harvest season.

All donations are distributed to the workers by the Migrant Ministry Committee at St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church in Onley, VA on Virginia's Eastern Shore on the DelMarVa Peninsula! Donation boxes will be available **beginning Memorial Day weekend.**

WHAT WE NEED: New or clean, gently worn donations; washed and folded

<u>Men's Clothing:</u> summer pants and jeans (38 waist max), sweatpants, shorts, flannel shirts, t-shirts, long-sleeve shirts, hoodies, sweatshirts, lightweight jackets, new/packaged socks & underwear

Special request for adult male sacrament candidates: white (long and short sleeve), new or gently used collared dress shirts (sizes small or medium); red neckties

Men's Shoes: tennis shoes, short leather boots, sandals, flip-flops (size 8-10 max)

Women's Clothing: summer dresses, skirts, and T-shirts (no shoes; no shorts; no capris; no jeans)

Religious Items: Spanish Bibles and dictionaries; rosaries

Toiletries: deodorant, shampoo, bars of soap, combs/brushes, toothbrushes/toothpaste

Sun Protection Items: sunglasses, sunscreen, lip balm, insect repellant, hats, caps

<u>Household Items:</u> lightweight cotton blankets, towels, sheets, washcloths, pots & pans, plastic dishes, laundry detergent, insulated lunch-bags, backpacks, duffle bags, skillets, griddles, plastic ware window fans (new or very good condition), soccer balls, basketballs, playing cards.

We cannot accept: Medications, baby food, baby formula, swimsuits, liquid bleach, electrical appliances, formal wear (tuxedos/evening gowns/prom dresses), bed pillows, wool and winter-wear, glass and ceramic dishes, placemats, tablecloths, bed skirts, pillow shams, or luggage.
