

#### September is the Month of the Seven Sorrows of Mary


- + Devotion to the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady has its roots in Sacred Scripture and in Christian piety, which always associates the Blessed Mother with her suffering Son.
- + This feast was introduced by the Servites in order to intensify devotion to Our Lady's Sorrows.
- + In 1817 Pius VII suffering grievously in exile but finally liberated by Mary's intercession — extended the feast to the universal Church.
- + "The Seven Dolors," the title by which it was celebrated in the 17th century, referred to the seven swords that pierced the Heart

Below are the seven sorrows of Mary:

- 1. The prophecy of Simeon
  - 2. The flight into Egypt
- Loss of the Child Jesus for three days
- 4. Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary
  - 5. Crucifixion and Death of Jesus
- 6. The body of Jesus being taken from the Cross
  - 7. The burial of Jesus

#### Activities to do as a family to remember The 7 Sorrows of Mary:

- + Make a heart-shaped cake for dessert, decorated with the swords piercing the heart.
  - + Learn to pray the Seven Sorrows Chaplet.
- + Pray the short prayer or aspiration: Holy Mother, imprint deeply upon my heart the wounds of the Crucified.
- +Read or sing the Stabat Mater, perhaps incorporating it with the Stations of the Cross.
