

September is the Month of the Seven Sorrows of Mary

- + Devotion to the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady has its roots in Sacred Scripture and in Christian piety, which always associates the Blessed Mother with her suffering Son.
- + This feast was introduced by the Servites in order to intensify devotion to Our Lady's Sorrows.
- + In 1817 Pius VII suffering grievously in exile but finally liberated by Mary's intercession extended the feast to the universal Church.
- + "The Seven Dolors," the title by which it was celebrated in the 17th century, referred to the seven swords that pierced the Heart of Mary.

Below are the seven sorrows of Mary:

- 1. The prophecy of Simeon
 - 2. The flight into Egypt
- Loss of the Child Jesus for three days
- 4. Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary
- 5. Crucifixion and Death of Jesus
- 6. The body of Jesus being taken from the Cross
 - 7. The burial of Jesus

Activities to do as a family to remember The 7 Sorrows of Mary:

- + Make a heart-shaped cake for dessert, decorated with the swords piercing the heart.
 - + Learn to pray the Seven Sorrows Chaplet.
- + Pray the short prayer or aspiration: Holy Mother, imprint deeply upon my heart the wounds of the Crucified.
- +Read or sing the **Stabat Mater**, perhaps incorporating it with the Stations of the Cross.

SAMs (St. Andrew Moms): SAMs is the umbrella group for different activities for Catholic Mothers (no matter your stage in motherhood: young mom, grandma, spiritual mom, mom-to-be) at St. Andrew in Roanoke.


