Sprinkles of Scripture, Catechism, crafts and activities to help build your Domestic Church! WEEK 3 ~ L (More ideas are on the St. Andrew's Web-Site under SAMs) us Rejoic

December 15th

- + Happy Third Week of Advent! We call today "Gaudete Sunday." Our Liturgical color is PINK.
- + This week we are going to focus on putting HOPE, FAITH, JOY and PEACE into action.

HOPE (this activity can be done as a family or each person make their own).: Make a paper chain of Hope! Cut out 15 strips of paper (1" x 4"). Write a different person's name on each strip that you'd like to pray for. Hang your chain(s) in your room or in a central place in the house. Beginning tonight, and every night after, ask Jesus to watch over the person on the first link in the chain. After you pray for that person, tear off the link. Each prayer gives HOPE to that specific person. Take all your prayers to Christmas Mass and pray one more time for them.

FAITH: Today either set up your Nativity set as a family or have your children draw a Nativity. Saint Francis was the first person to arrange a Nativity. He did this in 1223 at Midnight Mass with real animals! In your Nativity or picture, don't add baby Jesus until Christmas Eve. The Nativity is a wonderful way to remember that God sent us His son to be our Savior.

<u>JOY</u>: You are probably receiving packages and cards each day! Delivering mail in December can be quite cold and hard for our mail deliverers. Why not make them a thank you Christmas card and attach a candy cane or piece of Christmas candy to the card. You can even leave out a basket of goodies for all the delivery people to grab a snack or drink on the go! Make sure you have a "THANK YOU sign that includes "MERRY CHRISTMAS!" Spreading Christmas Joy is a wonderful gift to give!

PEACE: "Blessed are the peacemakers!" Today, work very hard on being kind, helpful, and letting things not get you upset when they don't go your way. Try hard to be the peacemaker in school, at home, and everywhere you go ~ smile, too! ③
