


We will not have Daily Mass, Adoration or Confessions on Thursday, December 26. We will have Daily Mass on Friday, December 27.

#### December 22nd

- + Happy Fourth Week of Advent! Our Liturgical color is PURPLE.
- + This week we are going to focus on the *O Antiphons* ~ a Monastic tradition that dates back to the before the 6th century!
- + The O Antiphon prayers begin on December 17th and end on the 23rd.
- + Each night for the octave (8 days) before Christmas, we ask Christ to come,

and call Him by a different name. This time is known as the "second part of Advent" or "The Golden Nights."

- + Each of these names starts with "O", such as "O Come O Come Emmanuel."
- + An antiphon is a liturgical composition, and they are traditionally sung. Therefore, they are called the O Antiphons.
- + The O Antiphons are taken from the Liturgy of the Hours (specifically, evening prayers, or "vespers"). Because they are traditionally said in the evening,

there is not one for Dec 24 because the evening on Christmas Eve is already the vigil of Christmas, so we are no longer waiting.

- + This might be a great tradition to bring into your home this Advent!
- +The antiphons address Christ with seven magnificent Messianic titles, based

on the Old Testament prophecies and types of Christ.

•Dec 17: O Sapientia (Wisdom)

•Dec 18: O Adonai (Lord and Ruler)

•Dec 19: O Radix Jesse (Root of Jesse)

Dec 20: O Clavis David (Key of David)

•Dec 21: O Oriens (Dawn of the East)

•Dec 22: O Rex Gentium (King of the Gentiles)

•Dec 23: O Emmanuel (God With Us)


