

Today we celebrate Candlemas. Candlemas is the Feast Day of the Presentation of our Lord in the Temple and The Purification of the Blessed Mother. It is calle Candlemas because candles are blessed on this day to help us remember the words of Holy Simeon who called the babe in his arms, "A light to lighten the gentiles and the glory of your people, Israel." Luke 2: 32.

When Jesus was brought to the temple Simeon was there, and he took Jesus in his arms and said that Jesus would be a light for revelation to the Gentiles, plus, that a sword would pierce Mary's soul. This is known as the prophecy of Simeon.

Here are a few ideas you can use to celebrate Candlemas in your home today: Have a Candlemas Tea/Luncheon/Dinner:

FOODS TO SERVE:

Crepes ~ make up a batch of crepes for your family. Fill with Nutella or fruit filling. Eating crepes at Candlemas date back to the 5th Century and symbolize the sun and Jesus being a "light to the gentiles."

Water~ to symbolize Mary's purification

Dove shaped sandwiches ~ to symbolize the doves offered

Pretzels ~ symbolize Simeon's praying arms

Black Olives ~ symbolize Anna being a widow

Sliced Strawberries with a spear ~ to symbolize Mary's pierced hed

White Hot Chocolate ~ to symbolize Mary and Joseph's purity

Candle Cookies ~ make these using Pinwheel cookies, Pepperidge Farm Pirouettes, mini marshmallows and orange sprinkles to symbolize Jesus' Light!

Of course, eat by candlelight!

Crafts:

- + Make a candle craft or dove craft. Lots of ideas on Pinterest and Google!
- + Have your children's Bible open to the story of The Presentation of the Lord and read from it during your tea party or at dinner.



Give the Gift of Prayer: Consider praying a Holy Hour with Our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration for the intentions of a friend, family member, or clergy member.

Spiritual Offering cards are available on the table set up in the commons during our regular Thursday afternoon Adoration time. After completing your Holy Hour, fill out the Spiritual Offering card and give it to the person you remembered in prayer for their encouragement and consolation.
