

Catholic Funeral and Burial Guidelines

Funeral Liturgy

The funeral liturgy is the central liturgical celebration of the Christian community for the deceased. When one of its members dies, the Church encourages the celebration of the funeral liturgy at a Mass at the parish church. When Mass cannot be celebrated, a funeral liturgy without Mass can be celebrated at a funeral home if necessary. A Vigil Service for the deceased sometimes takes place the evening before the funeral Mass.

At the funeral liturgy, the Church gathers with the family and friends of the deceased to give praise and thanks to God for Christ's victory over sin and death, to commend the deceased to God's tender mercy and compassion, and to seek strength in the proclamation of the Paschal Mystery. The funeral liturgy, therefore, is an act of worship, and not merely an expression of grief or a celebration of life.

Rite of Committal (Burial or Interment)

The Rite of Committal, the conclusion of the funeral rites, is the final act of the community of faith in caring for the body of its deceased member. Burial or Interment should be celebrated immediately following the funeral liturgy or as soon as possible afterward. It should be celebrated at the place of committal, that is, beside the open grave or place of interment. In committing the body to its resting place, the community expresses the hope that, with all those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith, the deceased awaits the glory of the resurrection. The Rite of Committal is an expression of the communion that exists between the Church on earth and the Church in heaven: the deceased passes with the farewell prayers of the community of believers into the welcoming company of those who need faith no longer.

Guidelines on Cremation

If a body is to be cremated, the family must still hold a funeral Mass with traditional funeral rites. The Church strongly urges and prefers that the full body (before cremation) of the deceased be present during the funeral Mass. If it is necessary that cremation occurs before the funeral, the ashes of the deceased must be present at the funeral Mass.

If a Catholic family chooses cremation, the Church requires reverent disposition of the ashes. The Church requires that ashes must be treated in the same way a body would be. The ashes are to be kept in a sacred place, not in one's home, not scattered, not divided among family members, or worn in jewelry. Burial in a Catholic cemetery or other sacred place is "above all the most fitting way to express faith and hope in the resurrection of the body". Ashes in an urn can be buried in a cemetery plot or interred in a columbarium or mausoleum as a final resting place.

When a Loved One Dies

Call the parish and speak with a priest or the pastoral care coordinator to initiate the scheduling and planning of the funeral liturgy and to discuss the burial plan for the deceased. The priests and staff at St. Andrew's are ready to guide you through the process alongside the funeral home of your choice.
