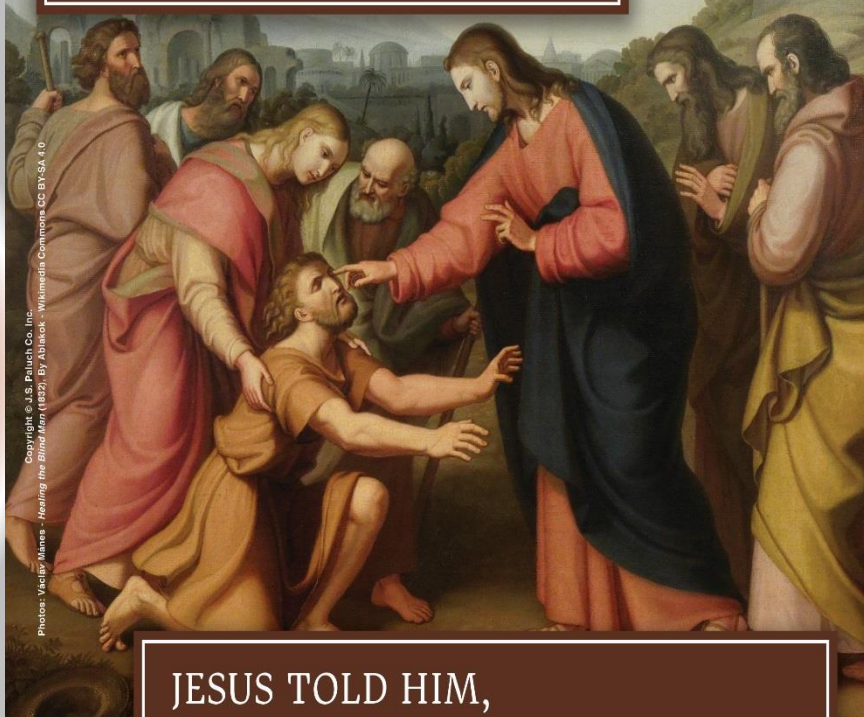

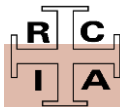

Prayer for All Saints



Almighty God, Your saints are one with You in the mystical body of Christ. Give us grace to follow them in all virtue and holiness until we come to those inexpressible joys, which You have prepared for those who truly love you. Amen.

THE HOPE AND PROMISE OF REDEMPTION

The prophet Jeremiah prophesies the end of the Babylonian exile. He describes how the weak and sorrowful people now return with joy. These are the scattered people of God: the blind and the lame, the mothers and pregnant women. They shall be led along an easy road so that no one will stumble. The Lord's kindness and mercy are on all these weak and broken people. Here and in Psalm 126 we find the most lovely poetic images of God's love and care for us. "Those that sow in tears / shall reap rejoicing. Although they go forth weeping, / carrying the seed to be sown, / they shall come back rejoicing, / carrying their sheaves" (Psalm 126:5-6). Although God had to punish Israel for their many sins, God never forgot them, scattered as they were, and brings them all back to the land of their ancestors, there to flourish and be joyful again. We can see in this the hope and the promise of our own redemption, gathered from the far corners of the earth into the great banquet of God.

St. Augustine's, St. James & St. Joseph's,

Week at REACH is mid-day 11/11 – breakfast 11/18.

We are the hosts the Reach Cold Weather Shelter from Sunday, November 11, 2018 – Sunday November 18, 2018. Volunteer opportunities include check-in desk, search, laundry monitor, hospitality, kitchen help, overnight assistant, and breakfast assistant. There is something for everyone, check out the descriptions to see what fits your style.

Check-in: complete documentation as resident's check-in for the night (1-2 people needed)

Security/Search: assist residents as they declare that they are abiding by the rules of the shelter (2 people needed)

Laundry: monitor that the residents who are signed up for laundry complete their washing and drying in a timely manner (1-2 people needed)

Hospitality: chatting with residents during the dinner hour. Playing games, too. (2-4 people needed)

Kitchen: assisting with meal prep and clean up. (6-8 people needed)

Overnight assistant: on-hand overnight in case of emergency. You may sleep for the night (in your private space) or you may remain awake if you are a night owl. (1 person per night. Some folks pair up as they play cards or read through the night).

Breakfast: assist shelter staff in the morning from 5-7am. Perfect for early birds. (2 people per day)

Desde el escritorio del Padre Juan Antonio

Exortacion Apostolica Amoris Laetitia

Debemos agradecer que la mayor parte de la gente valora las relaciones familiares que quieren permanecer en el tiempo y que aseguran el respeto al otro. Por eso, se aprecia que la Iglesia ofrezca espacios de acompañamiento y asesoramiento sobre cuestiones relacionadas con el crecimiento del amor, la superación de los conflictos o la educación de los hijos. Muchos estiman la fuerza de la gracia que experimentan en la Reconciliación sacramental y en la Eucaristía, que les permite sobrellevar los desafíos del matrimonio y la familia. En algunos países, especialmente en distintas partes de África, el secularismo no ha logrado debilitar algunos valores tradicionales, y en cada matrimonio se produce una fuerte unión entre dos familias ampliadas, donde todavía se conserva un sistema bien definido de gestión de conflictos y dificultades. En el mundo actual también se aprecia el testimonio de los matrimonios que no sólo han perdurado en el tiempo, sino que siguen sosteniendo un proyecto común y conservan el afecto. Esto abre la puerta a una pastoral positiva, acogedora, que posibilita una profundización gradual de las exigencias del Evangelio. Sin embargo, muchas veces hemos actuado a la defensiva, y gastamos las energías pastorales redoblando el ataque al mundo decadente, con poca capacidad proactiva para mostrar caminos de felicidad. Muchos no sienten que el mensaje de la Iglesia sobre el matrimonio y la familia haya sido un claro reflejo de la predicación y de las actitudes de Jesús que, al mismo tiempo que proponía un ideal exigente, nunca perdía la cercanía compasiva con los frágiles, como la samaritana o la mujer adúltera.

Domingo XXX del Tiempo Ordinario

El ciego Bartimeo es figura y símbolo de los discípulos de Jesús en aquel momento histórico, en que Jesús pasó por Jericó, y en todos los tiempos. Frente al misterio de la cruz y de la muerte ignominiosa, los cristianos experimentamos, con no poca frecuencia, la ceguera de Bartimeo, su inmovilismo, su indigencia. "Bartimeo, un mendigo, ciego, sentado junto al camino". ¡Cuántos Bartimeos en nuestro tiempo ante el gran misterio de la pasión y del dolor inocente! Hay mucha ceguera en los hombres ante la injusticia del sufrimiento, como si el no sufrir fuese la cumbre de la perfección humana. A muchos los pies se nos hacen de plomo ante la sola idea de caminar con Cristo hacia la ciudad del dolor y de la muerte. Permanecemos inmóviles en el territorio de nuestro ego, desgastados para ponernos en camino hacia la tierra del dolor ajeno. Somos indigentes, inmensamente indigentes de que alguien -o mejor Alguien- nos abra los ojos y nos arranque de nuestra inmovilidad. Cristiano es aquel que no tiene miedo al sufrimiento. Aquél que dice con igual decisión sí a la salud y al bienestar, que sí al sufrimiento y a la tribulación. Porque el sí del cristiano es un sí al misterio de Dios-Amor, y para los que aman a Dios todas las cosas contribuyen a su bien. Ojalá el Señor nos conceda a todos los cristianos repetir una y otra vez: "¡Señor, que vea!". Para que viendo crea, y creyendo siga firmemente tus pasos hacia la cruz. Cristiano es aquél que cree en Cristo y camina tras sus huellas. El seguimiento de Cristo no es el seguimiento de una doctrina, v.g. la de Pitágoras, la de Aristóteles o la de Zenón. Cristiano no es tampoco el que sigue un camino de vida trazado en páginas imperecederas, al estilo de los grandes maestros de moral de Oriente y Occidente. Cristiano es el que sigue a una persona, la persona de Jesús de Nazaret. Más aún, cristiano es quien presta a Jesucristo su humana naturaleza para hacerse presente en la historia en el hoy de cada día.

Lecturas del próximo domingo

El amor de Jesucristo al Padre y a los hombres hasta la cruz y la resurrección se renueva hora tras hora en cada altar donde se celebra la Eucaristía. El amor vertical y horizontal de Jesús, su amor universal, no ha pasado a la historia, sino que la cruza hora tras hora y día tras día hasta el fin de los tiempos. La Eucaristía es el amor redentor de Jesús eternizado, más allá de las condiciones históricas de su pasión y muerte. En la Eucaristía se repite, bajo el velo del sacramento, su pasión de amor en el corazón de la historia. A esta luz se comprenden dos urgencias pastorales:
