Stewardship

Many years ago, the Diocese of Worcester decided to conform its fiscal year to accommodate the needs of schools and their budgets by ending its fiscal year on August 31st. As a result, we are in the final weeks of this year's budget and expenses. The unexpected cost of our electrical bill for this past winter severely



compromised our efforts to try and balance our budget. In turn, we have worked hard to trim our costs while still maintaining our efforts to provide the services and ministries that people of our community expect and rely on. Added to this is that we continue to take our loose cash to pay down our commitment to the Legacy of Hope so that it is not charged for the cathedraticum, but it also means that those funds are not available to cover parish expenses. We are beyond the half way mark, but we still have nearly \$200,000 that we agreed to pay in order to proceed with our efforts to renovate the upper church. With this, we are holding fast to our commitment to direct donations for the renovation to that continuing need in our parish.

Any help that parishioners can provide these last couple of weeks to help us narrow the deficit of this year's budget will be greatly appreciated. In addition, we are grateful for those who continue to pay on their pledges and others who, having completed their pledge commitment, continue to donate toward the renovation of our church. Last we heard from the diocese, they were changing course and would write their own contract with our architect. We'll let you know what's next.

A Message from Father Peter

Dear Parishioners,

The uncertainty of our modern times should serve as a reminder to recall the events of this weekend and the coming week that occurred over 75 years ago in history. On Saturday, August 6th, as the Church celebrates the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, we recall the anniversary of the first use of atomic weapons against humanity. At the Potsdam summit of the Allied leaders from World War II in July of 1945, an ultimatum was issued to Japan for the total and unconditional surrender. Events were converging for the timing of this ultimatum: the leaders had just received word of the defeat of Winston Churchill as Prime Minister in Great Britain & the weapons had arrived at the military base at Tinian Island.

This first atomic bomb was dropped over the city of Hiroshima, unleashing the fury of hell previously unknown on the face of the earth. Within minutes, nine of every ten people within a half mile radius of ground zero were dead, nearly 100,000 in a city of twice that. Many more would die of their wounds and radiation in the ensuing weeks. The blast burnt the patterns of dark clothing onto skin, its light burning permanent shadows of bodies into buildings, one young boy was blown through the windows of his house and across the street. Nearly every building within a mile of the detonation was destroyed, all within three miles were damaged. Only ten percent of the entire city escaped unscathed and buildings twelve miles away experienced broken glass. An area of 4.4 square miles was completely incinerated, most of the victims were found to have broken legs from the impact, the result of which was they could not escape the flames of the fires that broke out.

Without the surrender of Japan, the intent was to drop a second bomb on August 11th, However, the weather became stormy and the only break would be on August 9th. So, it was planned for the second bomb to target the military arsenal at Kokura. Unfortunately for Nagasaki, that initial target had to be scrapped as the weather cleared over Nagasaki and the target was changed. As the bomber approached, clouds rolled in, obscuring the military target and the bomb was dropped mid city, over a more civilian populated area. The hills around the city contained the blast so that there was less expansive damage, but in containing the blast, the devastation and loss of life in Nagasaki was more terrific than the previous bombing. The next day, Emperor Hirohito ordered his military advisors to complete a nearly total surrender, which was formalized on August 15th, the feast of the Assumption of Our Lady.

So far, these are the only two instances when nuclear weapons have been used militarily against other human beings. Many fear we may live to see a third instance with the escalation of the war in Ukraine, NATO's resurgence, and the threats of China over the USA's support of Taiwan. Let us pray that this is NEVER repeated!

A Look Back ...: To Lease or to Buy?

The previous September, in 1976, the Pastoral Team mailed a detailed report to all parishioners about the parish's situation with the rental and possible sale of the school. The first thing they identified was that when the decision was made to close the school, the diocese turned to the parish as the largest shareholder in the real estate to ask if it wanted the property. The Team explains, "We judged, however, that it would be financially and physically impossible for the parish to use and support this large structure." So, with the diocese as the next largest shareholder, the property was transferred to the diocese, who had the responsibility to broker any rental or lease and eventual sale of the building to another party. And so, almost 38 months since the school had closed its doors from 77 years of educating Catholic youth, the stage was set for the Town Meeting and warrants 17, 18 and 19. The first (17) to make the official purchase, then (18) to authorize the School Committee to renovate and equip the school appropriately, and third (19) to request reimbursement of 65% from the state legislature. A long night of discussion was expected, and many feared the meeting would end in a deadlock between the town and the diocese. That possibility prompted Town Treasurer Anthony Rando to put forward a proposal the same day.

Rando's proposal, front page news for The Milford Daily *News* that Tuesday, May 10, 1977, suggested a way to cost the town less than its offer to the diocese of a half a million while meeting their asking price of just over a million. Before presenting the idea, he had passed by Bishop Flanagan, who admitted that he would agree to the terms. The details were that the town would pay \$300,000 in cash as a down payment and then rent the school with an interest-free lease -to-own at \$76,000 for ten years. This would bring the total paid to the diocese to \$1,060,000. From this figure, he subtracted \$689,000 as the reimbursement to be received by the town from the state, bringing the actual expense to the town as \$389,000. There were still amounts not included for the renovation and equipping of the building, but it would be well below the estimated cost of a new school at \$3 million such as Woodland elementary.

Rando's proposal came in for criticism, mostly since it arrived at 'the eleventh hour.' Selectmen Domenic D'Alessandro explained that there was not enough time to adequately review the figures and asked out loud where Rando had been for the last three years. Rando's reply was that he had been in his office, questioning in turn, "Before you accuse me of eleventh hour tactics, did you ever invite me to a meeting of this board?" He explained that he began working on figures when he felt that something should be done. Selectmen John Fernandes expressed the opinion that this proposal could resolve a possible deadlock at the meeting. "I think that Town Meeting members and the Diocese are heading for a difficult fight, possible a deadlock. I'm not sure everyone was sure of the figures. I think that's what Tony Rando has come up with is an attempt at compromise, and I hope the FinCom will take a hard look at the figures and also that Town Meeting members will take a hard look at those figures."

How Old Does a Child Need to Be in Order to Stay Alone? Don't assume that when your child understands what you're saying, he's ready to walk out the door by himself. Besides the fact that many states have laws against leaving children of certain ages alone (for example, younger than 12), experts say children shouldn't be left by themselves until they're capable of fighting off an abductor or handling a crisis situation. Experts also say children do not have the mental maturity to cross busy streets by themselves until they're about 10 or 12 year's old. (Did you know that pedestrian injuries rank third in child fatalities, behind traffic accidents and drowning?) Finally, parents who are certain their young children would never walk away with a stranger will be shocked to learn that studies show they probably will. Stay alert and vigilant, even if you believe your child is aware of possible dangers from others. 

At this time we need catechists for the following:


grades 4, 5, 6 and 1 more for grade 8.








XIX DOMINGO DO TEMPO COMUM 07 de Agosto de 2022, Lc 12:32-48 o 12:35-40

A Palavra de Deus continua a nos dar pistas seguras para saber como distribuir os bens que temos e nos convida a colocar nossos corações em uma direção diferente. A chave é estar preparado para não ser pego sem ter completado a obra confiada por Deus. "Vistam suas roupas de trabalho e



suas lâmpadas. Seja como as pessoas que esperam que o patrão volte do casamento para abri-lo assim que ele chegar e bater à porta" (Lc 12,35-36).

O Evangelho nos diz como ser administradores que cuidam dos bens do seu Senhor. Não podemos ser surdos ao cuidado mútuo, ao compromisso de zelar pela nossa casa comum: "o mundo". Todos nós temos algo ou alguém sob nossos cuidados, a família, a horta, a rua, a escola, etc. Por exemplo, como você cuidou de si e dos outros durante a pandemia? O que você aprendeu com tudo isso que vivemos no mundo todo? O Senhor nos pede que estejamos sempre vigilantes, atentos para estar bem despertos, quando ele vier pedir contas. E esse dia chegará: "A quem muito foi dado, muito será exigido; A quem muito foi confiado, mais será exigido" (Lucas 12:48). Coragem, tudo pode ser feito com fé! Não é uma questão de medo. É uma questão de dedicação e solidez com fundamentos fundados na nossa experiência e desejo de Deus. "Esse é um aspecto fundamental da vida. 
