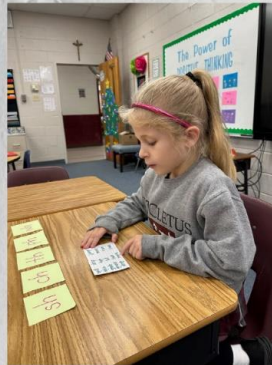

STEPS FOR PLACEMENT INTO THE COLTS PROGRAM

1. A current (within the last 3 years) full psycho-educational/psychological evaluation has been performed.
2. Students with a history of academic difficulty can be referred to the program by their teacher.
3. Once referred, parents will be asked if they would like their student assessed to see if they are meeting grade level standards.
4. Students will be assessed by using IXL, Lexia, and Aimsweb.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Students who qualify for the COLTS program receive additional instruction in ELA and Math during the regular school day.

This support is provided in addition to the core instruction that students receive in their daily, grade-level ELA and/or Math classes.

Students in grades K-3rd are placed on a weekly schedule and attend the program one or two days per week.

Students in grades 4th -7th attend the program on an as needed basis, as determined by the student and/or classroom teacher.
