FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

During this weekend we are having forty (40) hours of continuous adoration in our chapel. This is part of our eucharistic revival in our parish.

For that reason, I would like to share some helpful practical points taken from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops regarding receiving Communion.

Standing or kneeling? In this country, the Conference of Catholic Bishops has agreed that Communion should be received standing. However, if a baptized catholic desires to receive communion kneeling, it should not be prevented. Receiving Holy Communion standing or kneeling is acceptable.

On the hand or on the tongue? Communion may be received on the hand or on the tongue. If you receive on your hand, make sure your hands are clean and you are not holding anything else while you receive communion. You do not take the host. "If one is right-handed the left hand should rest upon the right. The host will then be laid in the palm of the left hand and then taken by the right hand to the mouth. If one is left-handed this is reversed. It is not appropriate to reach out with the fingers and take the host from the person distributing" (USCCB.ORG). If you receive on the tongue, open your mouth, stick out your tongue and the minister will place Communion on your tongue.

Amen! The person distributing Communion says audibly to each person approaching, "The Body of Christ." This formula should not be altered, as it is a proclamation which calls for a response of faith on the part of the one who receives. The communicant should audibly respond, "Amen," indicating by that response his or her belief that this small wafer of bread, the wine in this chalice are in reality the body and blood of Christ the Lord.

In Baptism we have been called to form but one body. The Eucharist fulfills this call: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (1 Cor 10:16-17).

If you are the body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are you respond "Amen" ("yes, it is true!") and by responding to it you assent to it. For you hear the words, "the Body of Christ" and respond "Amen." Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your Amen may be true (St. Augustine, Sermon 272: PL 38, 1247).

Our goal is to deepen in our relationship with God. The catechism of the catholic church states that "the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Cristian life" (1324). Let us consciously nourish our souls in the most devout and respectful way receiving Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.
