**FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK**

Love one another as I have loved you.

My dear brothers and sisters,

Last Sunday we as a church celebrated Vocation Sunday, a day to pray for more good and holy vocations and reflected on the call to imitate our Lord Jesus Christ, our Good Shepherd, who laid down his life for us, his sheep. Today we are invited to reflect on the fundamental vocation that unites and is at the center of all vocations in the service of the Lord: that is the vocation to love, to love God and others. In this Sunday gospel reading from John, Jesus commands his disciples and us today to ‘love one another as I have loved you’ (Jn 13:34). We must love one another, that is the Lord Jesus command to all of us. We do not love when I feel like it and we do not pick and choose whom to love. Love cannot be measured, especially when it comes to each individual or groups. Unfortunately, the love Jesus command us to live, practice and do, has become very superficial in our society today. Pope Benedict XVI in his Encyclical, God is Love, tells us that ‘love has become a much debased and overused word. It has been used to cover up what is the very opposite of love – domination and exploitation, and the abuse of others for one’s own pleasure.’ One may ask, what is love? If we look at the life and mission of Jesus, love is desiring the good of the other person. Love is a sacrifice, even in the simplest way. When we love, we are happier and especially closer to God who is God is LOVE himself. Saint Augustine tells that “When we love as God loves us, we become new men, heirs to the new covenant.”

In the gospel of today, once again Jesus tells His disciples and us now, “love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.” My brothers and sisters, our primary and most important vocation is to be saints, that is the being holy, but we created to and for love, especially to love God through others. We must love others, especially God, if we want to be known as disciples of Jesus. We must love as God loves us. We must love our enemies, those who want to do us harm, those who talk behind our backs, those who betray us and those who for some reason or no reason at all just do not like us. In any case, we must love, and our love must be unconditional. Let us remember Saint Paul’s words to the Corinthians, “Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails. How much do I and how much do you love others? God is Love and He loves you!

**DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL ADMINISTRADOR**

Ámense los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado.

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas,

El domingo pasado celebramos como Iglesia el Domingo de las Vocaciones, un día para orar por más vocaciones buenas y santas, y reflexionamos sobre la llamada a imitar a nuestro Señor Jesucristo, nuestro Buen Pastor, que entregó su vida por nosotros, sus ovejas. Hoy se nos invita a reflexionar sobre la vocación fundamental que une y está en el centro de todas las vocaciones al servicio del Señor: es la vocación al amor, a amar a Dios y a los demás. En la lectura dominical del Evangelio de Juan, Jesús ordena a sus discípulos y a nosotros hoy que « Ámense los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado» (Jn 13,34). Debemos amarnos los unos a los otros, ese es el mandato del Señor Jesús a todos nosotros. No amamos cuando nos apetece y no elegimos a quién amar. El amor no se puede medir, especialmente cuando se trata de cada individuo o grupo. Por desgracia, el amor que Jesús nos mandó vivir, practicar y hacer, se ha vuelto muy superficial en nuestra sociedad actual. El Papa Benedicto XVI en su Encíclica, Dios es Amor, nos dice que "el amor se ha convertido en una palabra muy degradada y sobre utilizada. Se ha utilizado para encubrir lo contrario del amor: la dominación y la explotación, y el abuso de los demás para el propio placer". Cabe preguntarse qué es el amor. Si nos fijamos en la vida y la misión de Jesús, el amor es desear el bien de la otra persona. El amor es un sacrificio, incluso en la forma más sencilla. Cuando amamos, somos más felices y, sobre todo, estamos más cerca de Dios, que es el mismo Dios AMOR. San Agustín dice que «Cuando amamos como Dios nos ama, nos convertimos en hombres nuevos, herederos de la nueva alianza.»

En el evangelio de hoy, una vez más Jesús dice a sus discípulos y a nosotros ahora: " que se amen los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado; y por este amor reconocerán todos que ustedes son mis discípulos". Hermanos míos, nuestra primera vocación y más importante es ser santos, pero hemos sido creados por y para el amor, especialmente para amar a Dios a través de los demás. Debemos amar a los demás, especialmente a Dios, si queremos ser conocidos como discípulos de Jesús. Debemos amar como Dios nos ama. Debemos amar a nuestros enemigos, a los que quieren hacernos daño, a los que hablan a nuestras espaldas, a los que nos traicionan y a los que por alguna razón o por ninguna simplemente no nos quieren. En cualquier caso, debemos amar, y nuestro amor debe ser incondicional. Recordemos las palabras de San Pablo a los Corintios: "El amor es paciente, el amor es bondadoso. No es celoso, no es pomposo, no es exagerado, no es grosero, no busca su propio interés, no se irrita, no se inquieta por los agravios, no se alegra por el mal, sino que se alegra con la verdad. Todo lo soporta, todo lo cree, todo lo espera, todo lo soporta. El amor nunca falla. ¿Cuánto amo yo y cuánto amas tú a los demás? Dios es Amor y te ama.
