From the Administrator's Desk

My dear brothers and sisters:

This weekend we as a church celebrate the Solemnity of all Saints and we commemorate all the Faithful Departed. The feast of all the Saints is a great reminder that each one of us is called to be saints. Some of us may think that to be saints is only for a few, especially the clergy and the religious, but no, everyone is called to be saints. At times in our lives, the goal of being a saint seems unreachable, impossible, but with the grace of God and our obedience to his will, everything is possible. A few practical ways in which we can strive to be saints: (1) We must have a desire to be saints and ask God for his grace to help us. (2) We need to frequent the sacraments, especially the sacraments of reconciliation and the Eucharist, with great devotion, we must celebrate these sacraments as if they were our first time, last time and only time. (3) We must be in constant union with God, love him through prayers, devotions, in serving the poor, and in living the Beatitudes, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven." (4) We must let go of everything in our lives, especially the things that keep

us away from him and we must let God, that is allow him to lead and to guide us wherever he wants to. We must surrender to him day and night and we must always put God first in our lives. For our reflection this week, let us meditate on the following questions. How can I become a saint today? What or who is preventing me from being a saint? Who can help me to be a saint? How can I help someone to be a saint? Do I allow God to take control of my life? I encourage all of us to strive to be saints by the grace of God.

Today, we commemorate all the faithful departed. We are called to pray for our loved ones who have gone before us, to remember them, and to thank God for the blessing they were to us in many ways. In the first Preface for the Dead, we pray, "Indeed for your faithful, Lord, life is changed not ended, and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven." Though some of our loved ones may not be here with us anymore, it is our hope and prayer that they are with God. In the face of death, the Church proclaims that God created each person for eternal life and that the Lord Jesus Christ by his death and resurrection has destroyed the chains of sin and death that bound humanity. In this day, we are to remember that death does not have the last word. All who are baptized in Christ Jesus share in his victory over death and nothing can separate them and us from God. My brothers and sisters, let us take a moment today and every day to entrust the souls of our faithful departed into the hand of God and let us once again remember the blessing they were to us. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

Desde el escritorio del administrador

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Este fin de semana nosotros, como Iglesia, celebramos la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos y conmemoramos a todos los fieles difuntos. La fiesta de todos los santos es un gran recordatorio de que cada uno de nosotros está llamado a ser santo. Algunos de nosotros podemos pensar que ser santos es solo para unos pocos, especialmente el clero y los religiosos, pero no, todos están llamados a ser santos. A veces en nuestras vidas, la meta de ser santo parece inalcanzable, imposible, pero con la gracia de Dios y nuestra obediencia a su voluntad, todo es posible. Algunas formas prácticas en las que podemos esforzarnos por ser santos: (1) Debemos tener el deseo de ser santos y pedirle a Dios su gracia para que nos ayude. (2) Necesitamos frecuentar los sacramentos, especialmente los sacramentos de la reconciliación y la Eucaristía, con gran devoción, debemos celebrar estos sacramentos como si fueran nuestra primera, última vez y/o única

vez. (3) Debemos estar en constante unión con Dios, amarlo a través de oraciones, devociones, sirviendo a los pobres y viviendo las Bienaventuranzas: "Bienaventurados los pobres de espíritu, porque de ellos es el Reino de los cielos". (4) Debemos dejar ir todo en nuestras vidas, especialmente las cosas que nos alejan de él y debemos dejar que Dios, es decir, permitirle que nos guíe a donde quiera. Debemos rendirnos a él día y noche y siempre debemos poner a Dios primero en nuestras vidas. Para nuestra reflexión de esta semana, meditemos sobre las siguientes preguntas. ¿Cómo puedo llegar a ser santo hoy? ¿Qué o quién me impide ser santo? ¿Quién puede ayudarme a ser santo? ¿Cómo puedo ayudar a alguien a ser santo? ¿Permito que Dios tome el control de mi vida? Animo a todos a esforzarnos por ser santos por la gracia de Dios.

Hoy, conmemoramos a todos los fieles difuntos. Estamos llamados a orar por nuestros seres queridos que nos han precedido, a recordarlos y a agradecer a Dios por la bendición que fueron para nosotros de muchas maneras. En el primer Prefacio para los Difuntos, oramos: "Ciertamente, para tus fieles, Señor, la vida se cambia, no termina, y, cuando esta morada terrenal se convierte en polvo, se les prepara una morada eterna en el cielo". Aunque es posible que algunos de nuestros seres queridos ya no estén aquí con nosotros, es nuestra esperanza y oración que estén con Dios. Ante la muerte, la Iglesia proclama que Dios creó a cada persona para la vida eterna y que el Señor Jesucristo, con su muerte y resurrección, ha destruido las cadenas del pecado y de la muerte que ataban a la humanidad. En este día, debemos recordar que la muerte no tiene la última palabra. Todos los que son bautizados en Cristo Jesús comparten su victoria sobre la muerte y nada puede separarlos a ellos y a nosotros de Dios. Mis hermanos y hermanas, dediquemos un momento hoy y todos los días a confiar las almas de nuestros fieles difuntos en las manos de Dios y recordemos una vez más la bendición que fueron para nosotros. Concédeles, oh Señor, el descanso eterno, y brille para ellos la luz perpetua. Que descansen en paz. Amén.
