

### From the Administrator's Desk

My dear brothers and sisters:

Today we as a Church are celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King. The solemnity of Christ the King marks the end of the Church's liturgical year, and a new liturgical year begins with the first Sunday of Advent. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to promote devotion to the Universal Lordship/Kingship of Christ the Lord in response to the growing secularism of the western part of the world. In 1969, Pope Paul VI gave the celebration a new title 'Jesus Christ, King of the Universe', and moved it from the last Sunday in October to the last Sunday in the liturgical year. It was also Pope Paul VI who declared this feast a Solemnity. As we celebrate this solemnity as Catholics, we must ask ourselves, what does it mean to worship Jesus Christ as King of the Universe? What kind of Lordship/kingship are we celebrating?

When we think of kingship, we always think of power, control, wealth, fame and a person who lives a life far from the reality of the ordinary people. But Jesus is not this kind of king. He was poor, born in a manger, he had nowhere to lay his head, no big staff to serve him, no fancy clothes and cars, he had nothing but, he was and is the shepherd who went to seek for the lost sheep, he was the compassionate Lord and healer whose touch brought inner peace as well as physical health to all those who came into contact with him, the man who came to serve others, especially the poorest of the poor, and not to be served, the suffering Messiah who on dying on the Cross forgave his enemies, the man who loves, who forgives, who is compassionate, who bring peace, this is why we are celebrating Jesus as King of the Universe and this is the kind of Lordship/Kingship we are celebrating today and every day of our lives. The world's idea of kingship, even in Jesus' time, seems to contradict everything that Jesus himself stood for and stands for today. And yet as his followers, we still honor and worship Jesus as King. But why? We honor and worship Jesus as King because he is the king of our lives, his palace and throne was the Cross on calvary. His crown was not gold or silver but of thorns. His subjects were those who accused and condemned him to death, us today. In the gospel for this feast, one of the criminals who were crucified alongside Jesus said to him, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise" (Lk 23:42-43). As we celebrate this Solemnity today, we must ask ourselves, is Jesus the king of my life? Jesus must be the king of our lives if we wish for him to remember us in his kingdom. When Jesus is the king of our lives, we lack nothing because we shall be princes and princesses in his kingdom. My sisters and brothers, is Jesus the king of your life right now? And if so, in what way? May Jesus Christ, King of the Universe bless us all!

### Desde el escritorio del administrador

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Hoy como Iglesia celebramos la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey. La solemnidad de Cristo Rey marca el final del año litúrgico de la Iglesia, y un nuevo año litúrgico comienza con el primer domingo de Adviento. Esta fiesta fue instituida por el Papa Pío XI en 1925 para promover la devoción al Señorío Universal/Reinado de Cristo Señor en respuesta al creciente secularismo en la parte occidental del mundo. En 1969, el Papa Pablo VI dio a la celebración un nuevo título de 'Jesucristo, Rey del Universo', y la trasladó del último domingo de octubre al último domingo del año litúrgico. También fue el Papa Pablo VI quien declaró esta fiesta como Solemnidad. Al celebrar esta solemnidad como católicos, debemos preguntarnos: ¿qué significa adorar a Jesucristo como Rey del Universo? ¿Qué tipo de señorío o reinado estamos celebrando?

Cuando pensamos en la realeza, siempre pensamos en poder, control, riqueza, fama y una persona que vive una vida muy alejada de la realidad de la gente común. Pero Jesús no es ese tipo de rey. Era pobre, nació en un pesebre, no tenía dónde apoyar la cabeza, ni un gran bastón que le sirviera, ni ropa ni coches elegantes, no tenía nada más que era y es el pastor que fue a buscar a las ovejas perdidas, era el Señor compasivo y sanador cuyo toque traía paz interior y salud física a todos los que entraban en contacto con él, el hombre que vino a servir a los demás, especialmente a los más pobres de los pobres, y no para ser servido, el Mesías sufriente que al morir en la Cruz perdonó a sus enemigos, el hombre que ama, que perdona, que es compasivo, que trae paz, por eso celebramos a Jesús como Rey del Universo y este es el tipo de señorío/reinado que celebramos hoy y todos los días de nuestras vidas. La idea mundial de la realeza, incluso en tiempos de Jesús, parece contradecir todo lo que Jesús mismo representaba y representa hoy. Y sin embargo, como sus seguidores, seguimos honrando y adorando a Jesús como Rey. ¿Pero por qué? Honramos y adoramos a Jesús como Rey porque es el rey de nuestras vidas, su palacio y trono era la Cruz en el Calvario. Su corona no era de oro ni de plata, sino de espinas. Sus súbditos eran quienes le acusaron y condenaron a muerte, nosotros hoy. En el evangelio de esta fiesta, uno de los criminales que fue crucificado junto a Jesús le dijo: "Señor, cuando llegues a tu Reino, acuérdate de mí." Él le respondió: "Amén, Yo te aseguro que hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso" (Lc 23:42-43). Al celebrar esta solemnidad hoy, debemos preguntarnos: ¿es Jesús el rey de mi vida? Jesús debe ser el rey de nuestras vidas si queremos que nos recuerde en su reino. Cuando Jesús es el rey de nuestras vidas, no nos falta nada porque seremos príncipes y princesas en su reino. Hermanos y hermanas, ¿es Jesús el rey de vuestra vida ahora mismo? Y si es así, ¿de qué manera? ¡Que Jesucristo, Rey del Universo, nos bendiga a todos!
