10. Number of Entries: Each exhibitor will be allowed to exhibit only one market entry in the show. The first entry presented for sifting is the entry. All entries must meet their respective division minimum weights in order to be eligible for resale price less applicable shrink and commission fees unless the carcass is condemned which will void any sale proceed going to the exhibitor who raised the entry.

a. Each exhibitor will be allowed to ENTER multiple Market Divisions of the Livestock Show. The exhibitor must pay the required entry fee PER division. If the exhibitor enters multiple divisions they MUST complete the MARKET ANIMAL ENTRY DESIGNATION FORM and return to the NCJLS office, post marked or hand delivered by the FIRST MONDAY FOLLOWING NCJLS Rabbit Validation, designating what Division in which they will be participating. Each exhibitor is allowed ONLY ONE market project to arrive at the show.

B. If the project designated becomes injured or unable to be exhibited after the deadline, the exhibitor must file an appeal. If approved by the NCJLS Board a project of a different division can be brought, providing an entry was paid for that division by the November 1st entry deadline.

(Failure to notify the NCJLS office of the division in which the exhibitor wishes to participate by the deadline WILL result in DISQUALIFICATION of ALL the exhibitor's market entries)

- C. No limit exists relative to the number of breeding pro jects an exhibitor may exhibit as stated under the respective breeding division rules. Breeding animals are not permitted to sell in the auction. Breeding classes in all divisions, except the horse division will be awarded ribbons.
- D. Exhibitors should reference specific divisional rules for non-animal maximum number of entries.
  - a. Judges will be permitted to judge two (2) consecutive years. All judges must be from outside Nueces County.
  - b. All individuals who are invited to judge in the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show will be required to sign an affidavit stating that he has not knowingly or willingly sold animals to exhibitors in Nueces County.
- 18. **Showmanship:** Showmanship competition will be divided into three (3) categories as follows:

Junior -- Grade 3rd - 5th as of August 31, 2022

Intermediate – Grade 6th - 8th as of August 31, 2022 Senior – Grade 9th - 12th as of August 31, 2022. Exhibitors must show their OWN animal in the showman ship drive. Showmanship judges will select exhibitors who will come back into the arena for showmanship competition. In all divisions except cattle and rabbits. The livestock judge will be given the opportunity to call back exhibitors he/she feels qualified for showmanship. The final decision on showmanship winners will be made by the livestock judge. All showmanship call-back finalists will receive a recognition award.

a. Each division superintendent will appoint a committee of two (2) showmanship judges who will select Junior, Intermediate and Senior showmanship finalists in all division except cattle, rabbits, horses and lambs. Finalists will be announced at the conclusion of each class. Those exhibitors selected shall return to the arena with the same animal shown during their respective class to compete for the Top Junior, Intermediate or

Senior Showman to be selected by the Livestock Judge and will receive a belt buckle if sponsorship is available. Reserve showmen in each age category will also be selected and will receive a jacket if sponsorship is available.

b. Showmanship competition will be held immediately following the selection of the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion of each division except rabbits. Each exhibitor will be eligible for showmanship honors in one breeding event and/or one market animal show per year.

19. **Red Ribbon/Sifted Projects:** Red Ribbon and Sifted market animals (beef cattle, swine, lambs and goats) can be sold at the resale price on request by the exhibitor. Animals not for resale must be removed from the show facilities immediately after judging/sifting. Red ribbon and sifted rabbits and poultry must be picked up by the exhibitor as there is no disposal of them.

Exhibitors of Red Ribbon or Sifted Projects who receive add-on contributions through the Show are required to write thank you letters to those supporters. (See General Rule #36). All animals not making the minimum weight requirements at weigh-in will be issued a white ribbon and WILL NOT be eligible for add-on contributions.

20. **Show Hours:** During the show, the Fairgrounds will open on Monday 7:00 AM - 9:00 PM; Tuesday 7:00 AM - 10:00 PM; and Wednesday through Saturday 6:00 AM - 10:00 PM. The premises will be cleared of all personnel

- 21. **Pen Assignments:** Pens and stalls will be grouped by clubs and chapters. Assignments will be given when the animal is checked in.
- 22. **Animal Care:** Water is available and wash racks are provided on the show premises. Each exhibitor will be responsible for feeding, watering and caring for his entry, which must be kept clean. The animal's safe keeping is the responsibility of its exhibitor until delivered to the resale buyer.
- 23. **Stalls, Pens and Equipment:** Feed and equipment must be kept in an orderly manner. Stalls must be cleaned and refuse disposed of before 9:00 AM daily. Each Division Superintendent will be responsible for enforcing the policies set for each division.
- a. All shavings, feed, animal waste or debris must be dis-posed of in designated containers or designated area. No such items shall be dumped in the drainage system at the wash racks, lavatories, or any place that has not been designated as such.
- b. **NO** animal project may leave the Fairground buildings after check-in without proper paperwork from division superintendent or designated representative.
- c. Blowers can only be used in the cattle division. Add Lambs to 23c
- 25. **Bedding:** No hay will be allowed for bedding only pine shaving or equivalent approved by General Superintendent will be allowed.
- 26. **No Pets:** No animals other than those on exhibition will be allowed in the Fairgrounds. No dogs with the exception of seeing-eye dogs will be allowed in the Fairgrounds.

- 27. **Neatness Awards:** The award will be given to the Club/ Chapter having the most attractive exhibit throughout the show. Daily inspections made by a judging committee will determine which club/chapter in their judgement, has the most attractive and best cared for exhibit, considering the following:
- a. Orderliness and cleanliness of quarter, stalls, and animals.
- b. Systematic and neat arrangement of feed and equipment.
- c. Promptness in stalls being cleaned by 9:00 AM daily or before.
- d. Personal appearance and conduct of exhibitors.
- e. Compliance with all rules and regulations.

19. Red Ribbon/Sifted Projects: Red Ribbon and Sifted mar- ket animals (beef cattle, swine, lambs and goats) can be sold at the resale price on request by the exhibitor. Animals not for resale must be removed from the show facilities immediately after judging/sifting. Red ribbon and sifted rabbits and poultry must be picked up by the exhibitor as there is no disposal of them.

Red ribbon/sifted projects are eligible to receive add-ons. White ribbons will be given to animals that are not considered to be of market quality and are not eligible for add-ons. Exhibitors of Red Ribbon or Sifted Projects who receive add-on contributions through the Show are required to write thank you letters to those supporters. (See General Rule #36).

All animals not making the minimum weight requirements at weigh-in will be issued a white ribbon and WILL NOT be eligible for add-on contributions.

Showmanship: Showmanship competition will be divided into three (3) categories as follows:

Junior -- Grade 3rd - 5th as of August 31, 2022 Intermediate – Grade 6th - 8th as of August 31, 2022 Senior – Grade 9th - 12th as of August 31, 2022

Exhibitors must show their OWN animal in the showman ship drive. Showmanship judges will select exhibitors who will come back into the arena for showmanship competition In all divisions except cattle ,swine and rabbits. The livestock judge will be given the opportunity to call back exhibitors he/she feels qualified for showmanship. The final decision on showmanship winners will be made by the livestock judge. All showmanship call-back finalists will receive a recognition award.

- a. Each division superintendent will appoint a committee of two (2) showmanship judges who will select Junior, Intermediate and Senior showmanship finalists in all division except cattle, rabbits, horses and lambs. Final- ists will be announced at the conclusion of each class. Those exhibitors selected shall return to the arena with the same animal shown during their respective class to compete for the Top Junior, Intermediate or Senior Showman to be selected by the Livestock Judge and will receive a belt buckle if sponsorship is available. Reserve showmen in each age category will also be selected and will receive a jacket if sponsorship is avail- able.
- Showmanship competition will be held immediately following the selection of the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion of each division except rabbits. <u>Each exhibitor will be eligible for showmanshiphonors in one breeding event and/or one market animal show per year</u>. PAGE 19

Exhibitors wish- ing to utilize the resale option must contact their re- spective committee members to obtain the necessary paperwork. All animals must be out of the barn by 9:00 AM Sunday, January 22, 2022. Swine Division—One hour rule/Premium animals: All premium Hogs & MUST be re- moved from the barn Friday from 8:00 AM until 10:00 AM, Thursday 6:00 PM - 8:00 PM WITH NO EXCEPTIONS after the release has been approved by the division superintendent. Lamb Division - One Hour Rule / Premium Animals All Premium lambs and Breeding Sheep will only be released to be removed from the barn on the following day after their show from 9:00— 10:00am. WITH NO EXCEPTIONS af- ter the release has been approved by the Division Superintendent.

#### **Current Rule:**

10. Each exhibitor will be allowed to <u>exhibit</u> only one market entry in the show. The first entry presented for sifting is the entry. All entries must meet their respective division minimum weights in order to be eligible for resale price less applicable shrink and commission fees unless the carcass is condemned which will void any sale proceed going to the exhibitor who raised the entry.

- a. Each exhibitor will be allowed to ENTER multiple Market Divisions of the Livestock Show. The exhibitor must pay the required entry fee PER division. If the exhibitor enters multiple divisions, they MUST complete the MARKET ANIMAL ENTRY DESIGNATION FORM and return to the NCJLS office, post marked or hand delivered by the FIRST MONDAY FOLLOWING NCJLS Rabbit Validation, designating what Division in which they will be participating. All entries must meet their respective division minimum weights in order to be eligible for resale price less applicable shrink and commission fees unless the carcass is condemned which will void any sale proceed going to the exhibitor who raised the entry.
  - a. Each exhibitor will be allowed to ENTER multiple Market Divisions of the Livestock Show. The exhibitor must pay the required entry fee PER division. If the exhibitor enters multiple divisions, they MUST complete the MARKET ANIMAL ENTRY DESIGNATION FORM and return to the NCJLS office, post marked or hand delivered by the FIRST MONDAY FOLLOWING NCJLS Rabbit Validation, designating what Division or Divisions in which they will be participating. Each exhibitor is allowed DNLY ONE ONLY TWO market projects to arrive at the show.
  - b. If the project either of the projects designated becomes injured or unable to be exhibited after the deadline, the exhibitor must file an appeal. If approved by the NCJLS Board a project of a different division can be brought, providing an entry was paid for that division by the November 1st entry deadline. (Failure to notify the NCJLS office of the division in which the exhibitor wishes to participate by the deadline WILL result in DISQUALIFICATION of ALL the exhibitor's market entries)

General Rule: 29

**Auction Sale** 

#### **Current Rule:**

29. Auction Sale: An Auction Sale will be held for those animals earning such privilege. To qualify for the Auction Sale, animals must have received a blue ribbon. Awards for all classes of market animals receiving blue ribbons shall consist of appropriate ribbons, plaques, and banners. The difference in the price received at the Auction Sale and that of the market price at the time of the auction will be considered the premium the exhibitor will have received for his efforts.

#### **Proposed Rule:**

29. Auction Sale: An Auction Sale will be held for those animals earning such privilege. Exhibitors with more than 1 market entry must sell the their highest placing entry, if both entries have the same placing, the entry that showed first will be auctioned OR exhibitor can pre determine their sale entry before the start of first market show (market lambs). To qualify for the Auction Sale, animals must have received a blue ribbon. Awards for all classes of market animals receiving blue ribbons shall consist of appropriate ribbons, plaques, and banners. The difference in the price received at the Auction Sale and that of the market price at the time of the auction will be considered the premium the exhibitor will have received for his efforts.

#### **COMMERCIAL OPEN/BRED HEIFER SHOW AND SALE**

#### **COMMERCIAL OPEN HEIFER SHOW AND SALE**

- 1, PURPOSE: The purpose of the Commercial Open Heifer Show and Sale is to provide a project that will expose the exhibitors to commercial cattle production. This includes the purchasing, development, exhibition, and marketing of commercial heifers. This project is not part of the Junior Livestock Premium Auction. Therefore, 4-H and FFA members can sell in this program as well as the NCJLS Premium Auction. However, exhibitors must abide by the General Junior Livestock Show Rules.
- 2. This show is limited to projects owned, fed and under the daily care of Nueces County 4-H and FFA members in good standing and under the supervision of the Agriculture Science Teachers and County Extension Agents. The Junior Commercial Heifer Show and Sale is an opportunity to show and sell commercial heifers. Any heifer exhibited in the Commercial Heifer Show will not be allowed to compete in any other Junior Beef Heifer Show of the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show (NCJLS).
- 3. An unlimited number of No more than five heifers may be tagged at validation per exhibitor. Exhibitor must own heifers 100% throughout feeding period starting at validation through time of show. Only two head will be allowed to compete in the show and sale. If a heifer is unable to compete and the exhibitor has only one (1) remaining heifer, that single heifer will be able to sell in the sale but will be ineligible to compete for awards or prize money.
- 4. Validation: To be eligible to show All junior commercial heifer entries will be tagged at RMBRF on September 5, 2023 (4:00 p.m.—7:00 p.m.). Each exhibitor is limited to show one pen of heifers (2 heifers). Each exhibitor may validate no more than 5 head. Any bred heifer will be disqualified. NO EXCEPTIONS. Family validation is permitted. Exhibitor must feed and care for his/her pen in Nueces County. Any exhibitor caring for or taking their pen of heifers out of the county must receive permission from the NCJLS Board per the NCJLS General Rules. Any exhibitor found to be feeding animals out of the county without proper consent from the NCJLS Board will be disqualified without refund of entry or nomination money. A nomination/validation fee of \$40 per pen will be required by August 1, 2023. Late nominations will be accepted but will be assessed a late fee of \$40.00. Cattle will be classified at validation. Classification

#### determination is at the Judge's discretion and is final.

#### Three Four divisions will be classified at validation:

\* British/Exotic-no Brahman influence

Brahman - 100% pure

\* American-less than 50% Brahman influence

F1 - 50%-99%

\* Brahman Influenced- 50% Brahman influence or more.

ABC - Less than 50%

\* AOB - British/Exotic

- **5**. An average weight of no less than 550 and no more than 800 pounds per head will be allowed at validation. Heifers will be weighed by pen or individually, but the average will be on all heifers in the pen.
- **6**. Animals may be grazed or fed and will be judged as replacement heifers.
- 7. \*\*OMIT Weigh-In & Check In: Final weigh in and check in will take place together on Wednesday, January 11, 2023 between the hours of 5:00 7:00 PM at RMBRF. Heifers will be palpated at that time at exhibitor's expense (payable to show vet directly-please have exact amount). All heifers are to be guaranteed open by a licensed veterinarian. Any bred heifer will be disqualified. Heifers must average a 1# per day weight gain from validation date to check in date or it will be sifted. Sifting for the show will be enforced at that time. Exhibitors are eligible for one re-weigh immediately following their first weigh in.
- 7. Weigh-In & Check In: Final weigh in and check in will take place together on Wednesday, January 10, 2024, between the hours of 4:00 7:00 pm at RMBRF. Heifers will be palpated at that time at exhibitor's expense of \$7 per head (payable to show vet directly-please have exact amount). All heifers are to be guaranteed open by a licensed veterinarian. Any bred heifer will be disqualified. NO EXCEPTIONS Heifers must average a 1# per day weight gain from validation date to check in date or it will be sifted. Sifting for the show will be enforced at the time. Exhibitors are eligible for one re-weigh immediately following their first weigh in. Heifers must be separated by individual pens at check in.

#### 8. Interview & Record Book:

Interviews will be based on the exhibitor's knowledge of all areas of his/her exhibit. Interviews will be scored using a number ranking system. Exhibitors will be required to participate in an interview on Thursday, <u>January 11, 2024</u>, starting at 8:00 AM. Judges will conduct interviews with the exhibitor's pen present. Cattle and Interviews will have time slots for judging. The Official Record Book provided by the committee must be used (with no alterations). Information should be correct and legible, with documentation including all expenditures. Each exhibitor will turn in 3 copies of their record book (1 original & 2 copies). <u>Any exhibitor who does not participate in the Interview or Record book portion of this contest will be automatically placed at the bottom of their class and will be ineligible for awards. Times are subject to change.</u>

#### 9. Judging Guidelines and Selection for heifers:

A. Quality, Conformation, and condition 30 Pts

B. Structural Soundness 30 Pts

C. Uniformity 30 Pts

The judges will use a number ranking system to score the heifers. The following will be considered when ranking the heifers: quality, conformation, condition, structural soundness, and uniformity.

10. AWARDS: Commercial Open Heifer Champion High Point (Banner & Buckle), Commercial Open Heifer Reserve Champion High Point (Banner & Buckle), Commercial Open Heifer Champion Pen (Banner & Buckle), Rosettes or ribbons will be given for the top 5 places in each division. These will result from the highest accumulation of heifer pen. Premium/prize monies may also be awarded if a donor is available. Salesmanship awards will be given for the 2 best combined Interview/Record Book scores in Junior, Intermediate, and Senior divisions. Champion Junior

Salesman, Reserve Champion Junior Salesman, Champion Intermediate Salesman, Reserve champion Intermediate Salesman, Champion Senior Salesman, Reserve Champion Senior Salesman, (Buckle). The Salesmanship Awards are combined with Open & Bred Heifer entries. A monetary prize will also be awarded if a donor is available.

- 11. Sale, Awards & Dinner: Commercial Heifer Sale will be held Friday, January 12, 2023 at 7:00 PM. Preview of pens will be 4:00-6:00pm. Dinner will be served at 6:00 pm and Awards will follow at 6:30 pm. All pens of heifers are required to sale. Beef checkoff fee will be deducted per the National Law on the beef check-off. A sales commission of 2% will/may be deducted from the sales price of each heifer to offset any marketing costs incurred by the sale contractor. Commercial heifer exhibitors are eligible to receive add-ons through the Premium Auction.

The Junior Commercial Heifer Show and Sale is an opportunity to show and sell commercial heifers. Any heifer exhibited in the Bred Heifer Show will not be allowed to compete in any other Junior Beef Heifer Show of the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show (NCJLS).
- 3. No more than five heifers may be tagged at validation per exhibitor. Exhibitor must own heifers 100% throughout feeding period starting at validation through time of show. Only two head will be allowed to compete in the show and sale. If a heifer is unable to compete and the exhibitor has only one (1) remaining heifer, that single heifer will be able to sell in the sale but will be ineligible to compete for awards or prize money.

#### **NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS and PARENTS**

One Hour Rule: Exhibitors choosing to retain ownership of their BLUE OR RED RIBBON animal for future use must notify the division superintendent in writing within 1 hour after their Division judging. (Refer to General Rule #28 for further information.)

Thank You Letters: Thank you letters are required from all exhibitors of blue ribbon, red ribbon or sifted projects to all buyers, add-on supporters and sponsors of awards for all divisions. (Refer to General Rule # 36 for further information/penalties)

- 1. Validation: All market swine to be entered and eligible to show must have been the property of the exhibitor, on feed and under his daily care by November <del>12, 2022</del>. 11, 2023
- 2. Validation will take place at designated locations on three (3) days to be determined by the Swine Validation Committee and published in this catalog. Dates and loca-tions must be submitted to the Show Office by May 15th.
  - a. To be eligible to exhibit in the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show, all market swine must be validated in the Nueces County Swine Validation Program. Market swine must be in the possession and under the daily feed and care of the exhibitor no later than the validation date. Validation will take place at the following dates and locations:
    - November 7th 6TH 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM Banquete Ag Building Calallen Ag Building
    - November-10th 10<sup>TH</sup> 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM Tuloso Midway Ag Building

- November <del>12th</del> 11<sup>TH</sup> (RMBRF) 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM only.
- b. All validation forms must be completed, accurate and in the hands of the county validation chair within 7 busi- ness days of the final county validation or pigs will be automatically disqualified.

Swine will be validated according to the latest guide lines set forth by the State Validation committee.

Each entry must be recorded on the Swine Validation Form Master list completed by the County Swine Validation Committee. The committee will be composed of 1 Ag Sci- ence Teacher from each chapter in the county, 1 County Extension Agent and 1 representative from each school district. Failure to comply with the rules and regulations of the Nueces County Swine Validation Program in any man- ner will result in immediate disqualification.

- Barrows/Gilts: Barrows and gilts may be shown in the Market Swine Division.
- 4. Check-In: Market swine must be on the show grounds starting at 1:00pm, and no later than 6:00pm, Tuesday, January 17, 2023. 16, 2024. Market Swine exhibitors MUST have eligibility voucher in hand in order to unload pigs. Voucher's for EVERY pig in trailer must be present at time of unloading. If vouchers cannot be presented for EVERY pig, the trailer will be sent to the end of the line. There will be NO partial unloading of trailers. Animals will not be allowed into the barn during Tuesday check-in that are sick or show signs of external parasites. If swine shows signs of stress a veterinarian along with swine superintendents will make the decision if the swine is allowed into the show. All swine must be disqualified and removed from the show grounds by the exhibitor within one hour if the animal cannot move under their own power.

- 6. Exhibitors in Sifting Area: Exhibitors only in scale and sifting areas.
- 7. Weights/Sifting: All swine will be weighed on CERTIFIED scales provided by the livestock Show and sifted by breed in sifting order on Wednesday morning, January 18, 2023 17, 2024 starting at 8:00am. All entries must report during their breeds designated time. If an exhibitor is unable to get to their swine to the scale within the allotted time, and final LAST CALL, the animal will be disqualified from competition. The animal must be removed from the show grounds between 2:00 and 3:00 pm January 18th, 2023. after the completion of the sift. The Classifier, present the day of sift, will classify all animals. The superintendent will review animals for signs of external parasites and any animals will be disqualified

and re-moved. Any market swine weighing less than 230 pounds or more than 280 pounds will receive one (1) reweigh on the official sift scales. Any market swine weighing less than 215 pounds or more than 295 pounds will NOT qualify for a reweigh. All swine must weigh a minimum 220lbs and a maximum of 290lbs. A 5 lb tolerance will be given over or under minimum and maximum weights to compensate for scale differences.

 Scales will be rebalanced between every breed and before each reweigh.

Pig and exhibitor are not allowed to leave the sift area until the reweigh is complete. Each reweigh is Fhis will be the final weight. All animals should be clean and washed prior to entering the barn for weighing. No clipping will be allowed in the swine area of the barn.

- a. All animals should be clean and washed prior to entering the weighing area and for the show. Swine should be groomed thereafter with water only (no oil based products) for the sift, show and sale. WATER ONLY! Foreign ma\_terial including (but not limited to) painting, oiling, artificial coloring, or adhesives is prohibited. If anything other than water is used during the show, the competitor/exhibitor will be placed last in class and will not be allowed to enter the show ring.
- b. Pigs MUST weigh a minimum of 230lbs to meet the requirements for resale/truck. Loadout. All pigs weighing 229 lbs or less must be removed Thursday January 18<sup>th</sup> between 6:00 and 8:00 PM. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to pickup the animal during the allotted time.   - 6. <u>Sifting:</u> Sifting of Live Birds A qualified sifter will be appointed by the show and all birds will be examined by him/her to determine live market value. Entries showing symptoms of sickness, disease or external parasites will be excluded from exhibition at the discretion of the sifting judge or the judge if discovered during the show. Bruising and/or breast blisters to the degree that is determined objectionable by the sifting judge, poor feathering to the extent that is deemed undesirable by the sifting judge, poor market condition of the bird and/or birds determined undesirable by the sifting judge will be excluded from exhibition. <u>Any Bird that dies after passing through sifting and deemed to be of show quality by the sifting judge, will still be allowed to show.</u>
  - 8. Attendance/Placing: All exhibitors must be with their entry during sifting and judging. The judge will place the entries on the quality of live birds. If a bird expires between check-in/preliminary scoring and call back of its respective quality group, the pen will be placed at the bottom of its respective quality group. If a bird expires in the arena during final evaluation, placing within its respective quality group will be left to the discretion of the judge. Ribbons will be awarded through ten places.
  - 10. **Showmanship:** Showmanship will begin after the judging of the turkey show in the main arena. All poultry exhibitors may compete for showmanship. Each participant will enter the show ring without a bird. Showmanship will consist of a verbal interview of poultry knowledge. Contestants will compete in age groups of Junior, Intermediate and Senior (refer to NCJLS Rule #19). The Judge will select a winner from each age division and then select an overall top showman from the top of each age division.

11. Release of poultry projects: All Blue Ribbon Projects must be displayed until they are auctioned or 5:00 PM on the day of the auction, whichever is earlier. Broiler exhibitors may take one (1) bird home after the judging, maintaining two (2) birds in pen until release, except for Grand and for Reserve Champions. Turkeys that are entered into major shows will be allowed to be removed right after the judging with prior approval from the poultry superintendent. Grand and Reserve Champion Turkeys must have a displayed turkey. Red Ribbon Projects should be removed after judging is complete. All poultry projects must be off the Show grounds by 9:00 AM the Sunday following the sale. All poultry projects must be removed from the Show grounds by the Friday after judging between 5-8 PM.

**Thank You Letters:** Thank you letters are required from all exhibitors of blue ribbon, red ribbon or sifted projects to all buyers, add-on supporters and sponsors of awards for all divisions. (Refer to General Rule # 36 for further information/ penalties.)

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this division is to educate, demonstrate, and encourage 4-H, FFA, and FCCLA members the importance of rabbit production, selection, standards of perfection and promote the interest of the rabbit industry.

#### **RULES: RABBIT DIVISION**

- 1. CLASSES: NO CHANGE TO CLASSES
- **2. BREEDS:** All rabbits entered in the show must be purebred. A complete listing of breeds can be found in the ARBA Standard of Perfection. Class 1 Market Rabbits and Class 2 Single Fryers must be a recognized medium meat breed such as Californian and New Zealand. Class 3 Breeder Rabbits must be one of forty eight (48) fifty (50) breeds recognized by the ARBA.
- 3. Validation:

**A:** December 16, 2023 from 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM. All rabbits must be in line by 10:00 AM at the RMBRF (exact location to be determined.) ALL RABBITS must be the property of, on feed and under the daily care of the exhibitor at the time of validation. All rabbits eligible for class 1 Market Rabbits, Class 2 Single Fryers, and Class 3 Breeder Rabbits will be tattooed at this time by a committeeman for permanent identification. Breeder Rabbits already having a legible numerical and/or alphabetical tattoo will not need to be re-tattooed, but must still be brought to

validation so that their numerical and/or alphabetical numbers can be recorded. We encourage breeder rabbits be tattooed prior to validation.

B: All rabbits must be presented for validation in wire bottom cage or carrier with a suspended floor. No boxes, crates, pet taxis or any solid floors will be allowed. Rabbits must be clean and healthy and show no sign of diarrhea. Rabbits that are deemed unclean either by urine, feces, or illness will not be validated or checked in.

C: Rabbits weighing over 3 pounds at time of validation will not be validated.

D. Per General/Show rule #6 on animal residency, a physical housing address must be provided at time of entry. All rabbits, including market, fryer, and breed rabbits, must be housed at this address. **Random spot checks may be completed by committee members.** 

4: Check-In/Weigh and Sift: Market Rabbits and Single Fryers will be weighed and sifted on Wednesday, January 17, 2024 from 12:00 PM TO 5:00 PM at the RMBRF. Breeder Rabbits will be weighed and sifted on Wednesday, January 17, 2024 from 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM at the RMBRF. Exhibitors will present market/fryer rabbits to sifting judge. The committee will not pick pens or fryers during the sifting process. All rabbits must be presented for validation in wire bottom cage or carrier with a suspended floor. No boxes, crates, pet taxis or any solid floors will be allowed. Rabbits must be clean and healthy and show no sign of diarrhea. Rabbits that are deemed unclean either by urine, feces, or illness will not be validated or checked in. All rabbits will be weighed and sifted in the presence of a qualified judge and must meet weight standards for class and breed according to ARBA Standard of Perfection. Market Rabbits and Single Fryers not weighing between three and one-half pounds to five and one-half pounds or displaying any signs of disease, external parasites or physical abnormalities will be sifted. If any rabbit in the pen is sifted, a qualified alternate must immediately be substituted in the presence of the sifting judge or the entire pen will be sifted. All rabbits besides the market and fryers must be removed from the barn immediately following check-in. There will be no refund of entry fees for sifted animals.

#### A. No storing of any accessories items on top of cages.

**5:** Showmanship: Showmanship will begin at approximately 6:00 PM following check-in on Wednesday, January 17, 2024 in the show arena. Showmanship will consist of a hands-on demonstration of rabbit knowledge to a qualified showmanship judge. Participants will need to demonstrate their ability to handle and care for their rabbits as well as general knowledge of rabbits in a verbal interview with the judge. Contestants will compete in age groups of Junior, Intermediate, and Senior (refer to NCJLS rules #19). The judge will select a winner from each age division and then select an overall top showman from the top of each age division. Rabbits used for showmanship must be participating in the show. (Breeders, market or fryer) It cannot be an extra rabbit.

- **6: Judge:** Market Rabbit judging will begin at 8:00 AM, Thursday, January 18, 2024 in the show arena. Single Fryer judging will begin immediately following Market Rabbit judging conclusion. Breeder Rabbit judging will begin immediately following Breeder check-in on Wednesday, January 17, 2024 in the show arena. All exhibitors must be present with their rabbits at time of judging or the exhibitor's project will be subject to elimination. Should an exhibitor have conflict and cannot be with his/her project at time of judging, he/she must contact the Superintendent immediately for consideration. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their animals and carriers are encouraged in the arena with water only, no feed, no chairs or stools will be allowed in arena due to limited room.
- 7. ARBA Standards: The rules of the American Rabbit Breeder Association (ARBA) Standard of Perfections latest edition will be used by the sifting judge and show judge. All ARBA disqualifications, eliminations and general faults will apply to each entry. Only qualified ARBA judges will be selected and their decisions shall be considered final. A judge shall not be required to place more than twenty five (25) entries in classes of fifty (50) or more No committee member, board member or show associate will instruct the judge on the number of blue ribbons awarded. Instruction will however be given to the sifting and show judge that only high quality animals be accepted.
- **8. Release:** All rabbits and attached items are to be removed from the show cages by 9:00 AM Sunday morning following the sale. after the closing of the auction. Any rabbits or related items left after this time will be removed and disposed of by a rabbit committee member. Any exceptions to this rule must be approved by the Rabbit Committee Superintendent.
- **9. Sale**: Grand and Reserve Champion Market Rabbits are required to participate in the Parade of Champions on Saturday. Grand and Reserve Champion Single Fryers and Grand and Reserve Champion Breeders may participate in the Parade of Champions on Saturday provided they are in line at designated time. Blue ribbon Market Rabbits will sell in the Blue Ribbon Sale (refer to General Rule #30) in alphabetical order according to club; this order will rotate from year to year. Exhibitors are expected to be with their rabbits 30 minutes prior to the market rabbit sale. and are required to be with their-rabbits at the time of sale. **Premium sale only.** All locks must be removed from the pens on the day of the sale.

#### **RULES: MARKET RABBIT CLASS**

1. Market Meat Pens: Meat Pens shall consist of three (3) rabbits, of all the same breed and variety. Meat Pens does not necessarily have to come from the same litter. Age limit 10 weeks, (70 days). Minimum of 3 ½ pounds each. Maximum weight 5 ½ pounds.

Goats may be vali- dated by family name where more than one child in the immediate family is raising goats. All goats will be tattooed, tagged with special plastic ear tags and have hair sample pulled for DNA testing. The exhibitor or designated representative will sign his/her name in the master book verifying the ear tag number. Any goat not present for validation will not be eligible for show.
  - a. If the ear tag is lost, one county agent or Ag Science teacher and either the goat superintendent or assistant superintendent must be notified and the goat must be re-tagged within seven (7) days.

- 1. **Entry Requirements**: In accordance with item #1 of the General Rules, the horse entered shall be approved by the exhibitor's supervisor as to complete eligibility. Should the entry be determined ineligible, the entry fee will be returned.
- 2. Eligibility of Participants:
  - a. The exhibitor must manage at least one horse of any age or breed as a horsemanship project. The horse must be owned by the member, member's parents, brother, sister, grandparent or guardian by October 31, 2022. This horse must be under management of the exhibitor by October 31, 2022.
  - b. The horse must be owned and certified as a 4-H, FFA or FCCLA project.
- 3. Age Groups: Exhibitors will be divided into Junior Classes, age 13 and under as of August 31, 2022 and Senior Classes, age 14 and over as of the date. (See General rule #3 for age requirements)

4. **E** 

a. <u>Validation Entries</u> Must be turned into the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show Office along with proof of ownership (October 31, 2022) by the NCJLS entry deadline, October 21, 2022. An exhibitor may validate as many horses as they wish.

There is a \$10.00 validation fee per exhibitor, no matter how many horses are listed by that individual.

b. A front and side profile picture of each horse must be turned in with the proof of ownership.

Change year from 2022 to 2023 where necessary.

- c. Exhibitors **MUST** sign NCJLS Entry form verifying they have received a copy of the **NCJLS Horse Show Rule Book.**
- d. <u>Class entries</u> must be postmarked by December 1, 2022. These entries are to be mailed to the <u>official Horse Show Secretary</u>. Entry fees for each class will be \$20.00 per class. All cattle and goat classes will have an additional \$2.00 stock fee.



e. Late class entries or changes will not be accepted.

There will be no exceptions.

#### 5. Dress Code:

- a. Strictly western attire in the arena at all times.
- b. Shirts must have a collar and full length buttons, snaps, or zipper in the front or back. Shirts must be long sleeved and cuffed and be worn with sleeves down and cuffs buttoned or snapped with no rolled up sleeves.
- c. Shirts must be tucked in pants at the beginning of the run or riding event.
- d. The wearing of western hats shall be left to the discretion of the arena director. When the hat rule is in effect, hat must be on head when attempting the run or riding event.
- e. No caps or curlers will be worn.
- f. Western boots must be worn in all events with the exception of English events. Lace up tennis shoes with a riding heel are not considered western boots.

- b. Points will be kept on (1) contestant/horse combination. Performance events are eligible for consideration towards the High Point Performance Award. The same will be in effect for Speed Event High Point Awards.
- c. Points received in Halter Classes & Showmanship at Halter shall NOT be eligible for Speed High Point Awards.
- 12. In the event of an unbreakable tie, the Champion prize will be split equally between Champions and this will be determined by the Committee.
  - 13. **Ribbons/Banners**: Rosettes will be given for 1st through 2nd places and ribbons will be given for 3rd through 10th place contestants in each class. These awards will be chosen by the Horse Committee based on financial resources available at show time. Banners only will be given to the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of each sex in the halter division.
- 14. Judge: The selection of a judge must be approved by majority vote of the NCJLS Horse Committee.
- 15. Gail Cardwell Shanahan Sportsmanship Award: Awarded to an individual displaying outstanding sportsmanship during the NCJLS Horse Show.

16. Appeals Committee - If a contestant feels he/she has a legitimate complaint, he/she will be required to file a PROTEST FEE of \$200 with the arena director before the end of the event in which the incident in question occurred.

The appeals committee will be comprised of the Horse Division Superintendent and General Superintendent and one NCJLS Board member. Ruling on the complaint will be final.

#### **RULES: HOMEMAKING DIVISION**

- 1. Eligibility—See General Rules
- 2. Exhibitors will be divided into the following grade levels:
  - a. Junior 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades
  - b. Intermediate 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grades.
  - C. Senior 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> grades.
- All rule changes affecting the homemaking division must be submitted and approved by the homemaking committee prior to submission to the NCJLS board.
- Homemaking Entry Cards will be issued to ALL homemak- ing exhibitors with the containers. <u>COMPLETED entry card</u> <u>MUST accompany entry at check-in.</u>
- Entries will be accepted at check-in from family members, teachers, adult leaders, friends or exhibitors. ALL HOME MAKING ENTRIES MUST BE ENTERED UNDER ONLY ONE (1) CLUB.
- 6. Homemaking packets will be issued at check-in only with the presentation

- of a properly completed School Eligibility Voucher (General Rule #6). Completed entry labels and cards need to be attached (with safety pins, tape, etc.) to each entry prior to registration. Entries that do not follow the Homemaking Division Rules may be **disqualified**. Disqualification may occur during the judging. Acceptance of an entry at Check-in is not an acknowledgement that an entry meets all homemaking division rules.
- 7. All entries must be the work of one exhibitor and will be judged accordingly. Clothing, Creative Stitchery, Arts, Crafts and Photography items can only be entered one (1) time in the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show and no portion of any project may have been entered in the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show previously. All entries may be subject to a non-invasive marking system.
- 8. ONLY the number of Division (Arts, Crafts, Clothing, Creative Stitchery, Foods and Photography) entries marked on entry forms will be accepted at check-in. Exhibitors must declare the division and category of each item entered prior to time of check-in. All division Superintendents and Assistant Superintendents, at their discretion, may change a category, make new categories or combine categories as they deem fit. Committee superintendents and assistant superintendents have the ability to transfer a project to a more suitable category within a division.
- 9. Any entry deemed unpresentable by the division Superin- tendent and Assistant Superintendent will be removed from public display and/or disqualified. <a href="Entries shall">Entries shall</a>
  <a href="mailto:not include controlled substances">not include controlled substances</a>. Visible branding of alcohol, tobacco and/or cannabis products are not acceptable and will be disqualified.
- 10. Entries may not be presented with or accompanied by any external fixture or display (i.e. dress forms, jewelry displays or any other display item). An external fixture or display is defined as an item accompanying the project that is not necessary to the function of the item (i.e. a vase for a flower arrangement is necessary for the function of the arrangement; however a shelf to set the arrangement on is not necessary to the function of the arrangement.) Only the item/project to be judged shall be entered. No set-up is allowed of any item by exhibitor, parent, club manager or any other person. Project shall be relinquished at the check-in table and no further handling, special handling or set-up will be allowed.
- 11. No names, pictures, or other contact information can be evident on ANY entries, (which includes school projects, 4- H Projects, etc.) Paper may be used to cover the marking and will not negatively impact judging.
- 12. The judges of each of the categories may choose up to three (3) placing entries. The 1st place winners from each category will be judged and a Grand Champion selected. The 2nd place entry from the winning category will be brought forward to compete for Reserve Champion honors. Difficulty, uniqueness, time commitment, workmanship, design element and overall quality will be considered when placing projects.

  All projects are subject to verification of rules.
- 13. Entrants who receive placing ribbons (1st, 2nd, 3rd) may receive additional prizes. Thank-You notes are required for all division placing prizes. Notes may be written on site Thursday 10:00 AM to 7:00 PM and Friday 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM to collect prizes immediately. Completed thank you notes will be accepted at the second chance pickup on Saturday, or completed thank you notes can be turned in by February 9, 2023 2024 to the show office or homemaking committee superintendents in order to collect prizes. Spon-sor/donor information will be provided prior to the release of any prizes. Any unclaimed prizes after the deadline will be recycled for the following year.

14. <u>All Exhibitors</u> are subject to an interview and may be required to produce a pictorial evidence of the creation of each item. The interview will be conducted by designated members of the homemaking committee. Items and/or entrants which may remain in question, may be subject to disqualification.

#### Rule A below.

- 1. **YEAST BREADS** Any bread leavened with yeast. Entry must be a whole loaf, **uncut loaf**, three (3) mini loaves or six (6) rolls removed from pans.
- QUICK BREADS Any bread leavened with leavening agents other than yeast (i.e. banana bread, pumpkin bread, etc.) Entry must be <u>a</u> whole <u>uncut</u> loaf, three (3) mini loaves or six (6) rolls or muffins removed from pans.
- CAKES Entry must be a whole cake made from scratch. Cakes that require icing while hot must be entered in dis- posable aluminum pans. Pans must fit inside plastic container provided by the Homemaking Division.
- 4. **CUPCAKES** Entry must be six (6) cupcakes. Cupcake liners are acceptable.
- CANDY Entry must display a minimum of twelve (12) pieces of candy.
   Paper nut cups and cupcake liners are acceptable, for candy display purposes.
- COOKIES Entry must display a minimum of twelve (12) cookies.
   Commercially prepared ingredients such as cara- mels, marshmallows, almond bark or melted chocolate chips are acceptable.
- BAR COOKIES AND BROWNIES Entry must display a minimum of twelve (12) cookies.
- 8. PIES AND STRUDELS Entry must be a whole pie or stru- del, or six (6) tarts. Pie crust must be made from scratch by exhibitor and pie crust recipe must be included. Pie must be entered in a disposable aluminum pan. Only cooked fillings and toppings will be accepted.
- JAMS, JELLIES AND PRESERVES -Display is one (1) jar of canned goods; one (1) additional jar may be presented at check-in if the 1st jar is disqualified.
  - A. The jar must have a single undecorated label on it with the name of the contents recipe name and the date it was canned, either typed or clearly printed.
  - B. All canned items must be in a standard canning jar NO SMALLER THAN A HALF PINT eight (8) ounces with a two-piece canning lid and must have an airtight seal.
  - C. For safety precautions, a committee member at check- in, in the presence of the exhibitor, parent and/or leader, will open canned foods to check the seal qualification. Contact the Nueces County Extension Office for proper canning methods or check the USDA/Extension Service Guide 1, Principle of Home Canning, http://www/uga.edu/nchfp/publications/publications\_usda.html
- 10. SALSA AND SAUCES refer to Jams, Jellies and Pre- serves for rules.
- 11. PICKLED ITEMS refer to Jams, Jellies and Preserves for rules.

#### **FOOD DIVISION - GENERAL RULES**

A. All Food Division entries must be prepared from SCRATCH. "From scratch" means WITHOUT any commercial preparation that provides an extra advantage to the exhibitor .

#### Use of the following items will result in disqualification.

- Cannabis or its byproducts

- D. Exhibitors must provide recipes for each Food entry on an 8 1/2 x 11 white paper, front side only, inserted into a clear sheet protector or gallon zip-top bag. No names on recipe. If the recipe is longer than one typed page, please indicate continuation at the bottom of the page (i.e Page 1 of 2). Recipes from the Top three (3) win- ners of each age division and Food category may be published in a cookbook.
- E.All entries, except canned items, must use containers and boards provided by the Homemaking Division. All entries must fit inside the container and close securely. All entries, except canned items, must be displayed on the white cake board provided by the Homemaking Division. Only white food grade paper may be used to cover the boards. Cupcakes may use cupcake liners. Candies only may use either paper nut cups or Cup cake liners. No other containers, bowls, plates or doilies are allowed. No decorations are allowed either inside or outside the Food containers or jars, including but not limited to ribbons, artificial flowers, toys, trinkets, etc.
- F. All Food Division entries become the property of the division and will not be returned to the exhibitor.

G. A baked good that is entirely gluten free and that has been judged "Best Gluten Free Baked Good" may receive an award. The recipe must be 100% gluten free and "Gluten Free" must be noted at the top of the recipe. Baked goods include yeast breads, quick breads, cakes, cupcakes, cookies, bar cookies, brownies, pies and strudels.

- PEOPLE Images of a person or group of people, includ- ing babies, children, teens and/or adults. May be alone or in a group, candid or posed, or inactive. Fashion/ modeling (to include hands, feet and facial features) and sports images are included in this category. (Color images only)
- ANIMALS Animal life, including domestic, wild, and underwater creatures. These photos should focus on the various animals that have been tamed for a human envi- ronment and / or not tamed, commonly found in the wil- derness or bodies of water. (Color images only)
- 3. LANDSCAPES Both nature and urban landscapes Images focusing on the beauty of the outdoors, including landscapes, outdoor scenes, nature images, sunsets, seascapes and farms. Images focusing on the architec- ture, design and structures of cities and urban areas, including cityscapes, architectural images, buildings, monuments, industrial areas and factories. (Color images only)
- 4. PLANT / FLORAL Photos of interesting, unique, and beautiful flowers and flora. Photography can occur out- doors or indoors. Photo subject should be that of a sin- gle flower, plant, bush, tree, etc. Large collections of plant/flora should be considered for entry into the Landscape category. (Color images only)
- 5. DETAILS & MACRO Getting in close is the name of the game for this category. We welcome pictures of small details that suggest a larger story. This is also the place for macro photographs (although a macro image of a flower might equally go into the Flowers category). Examples for this category would be clocks, coins, ice crys- tals, insects, etc. (Color images only)
- DOMINANT COLOR Photos of a dominant color. The dominant element in the image must be a specific color, such as yellow, blue, white, black, etc. Black & White photos, duotones, are excluded from this category. (Color images only. Does not include digitally altered photos)
- BLACK & WHTIE- WHITE Images may be produced through camera settings or digital editing. Must be in grey-scale only. (sepia-tone and antiquing are not allowed) Includes people, animals, landscapes, plants/flora, or details & macro.
- SPECIAL EFFECTS Images that have been altered to bring out dramatic or artistic qualities, including images manipulated with camera settings, the use of filters, or software programs. Digital editing must be the work of the exhibitor. (Color, sepia, antiqued or combination images)
- MOTION/ACTION The capture of movement within a single photo.
   This category should focus on specific tech- niques such as freezing or

#### blurring motion.

10. NIGHT PHOTOGRAPHY - Photos taken outdoors be- tween dusk and dawn. Generally these photos are achieved by using artificial light or using a long expo- sure. The category can include any subject as the focus should be on the skill and technique used to acquire the photograph

#### PHOTOGRAPHY DIVISION - GENERAL RULES

- 1. Photography Submission/Check-In is a two (2) step Process: BOTH STEPS MUST BE COMPLETED:
  - A. <u>Step 1:</u> All photos must be submitted online at <u>ncjls.org</u> (the same portal used for log-in at registration) by midnight on <u>December 31, 2022.</u>
  - B. Step 2: All photos must be printed, and the printed copy must be submitted at check-in on January 16, 2023. Photographs must be a mimum minimum size of 8' x 10" and no larger than a maximum size of 11" x 14". Photographs must be mounted on foam board or mat board with no visible border. Exhibitor may indicate the orientation of the photo by drawing an arrow on the back of the photo mat board.
- Each Photograph <u>MUST</u> be submitted at check-in individually in zip-top bags.
- The Homemaking Division will provide a Photography entry card to be <u>placed in the zip-top bag.</u> Card will include a space to give a description/title of photograph
- 4. No Frames, glass, mats or hangers will be accepted.
- Content and Copyright: All photos must be an original photograph taken by the exhibitor. Photographs are subject to all applicable copyright laws. Photos that are deemed obscene, vulgar, hateful, threatening, or otherwise in violation of law are strictly prohibited and will be disqualified.
- 6. Model and Property Release: The submission of a photograph acknowledges that the photographer has obtained a required permission of any recognizable locations or people appearing in their photograph(s). The entry into this contest acknowledges that the exhibitor has obtained this permission and that the photographer and the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show may publish and use the photos as desired. Written documentation should be retained by the photographer and may be requested by the Photography Division.

4f. All accompaniments used in talent must be on a flash/jump/travel drive. Only one version of the version of the song may be submitted on the flash drive. No other computerized/digital media, including but not limited to laptop, MP3, cell phone, iPod, iPad, etc. will be allowed. All music must be on a flash/jump/travel drive. Music must be edited to stop within the time limit. The sound technician will not 'fade in/out' in order to fit the time limit. The committee will not provide any musical instruments, including piano. Two copies must be turned in at rehearsal.

- 20. Miss Top Evening Gown: All contestants will be eligible for Miss Top Evening Gown. Winner is the contestant who receives the highest evening gown score. In the case of a tie, both contestants will receive the title and awards.
- 21. Miss Top Western Wear: All contestants will be eligible for Miss Top Western Wear. Winner is the contestant who receives the highest western wear score. In the case of a tie, both contestants will receive the title and awards.

#### **RULE CHANGES:**

- 1. Eligibility: Any active member of a Nueces County FFA or FCCLA chapter or 4-H club who will graduate this academic year, and has actively participated in the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show for at least two of his/her high school years, is eligible to apply for the Nueces County Junior Livestock Show Scholarships. Applicants must have entered and exhibited three or more project categories within each year of the two required years.
- 3. Judging Criteria: Criteria used in selecting scholarship recipients will include: (1) Stock show NCJLS participation (2) FFA, FCCLA or 4-H participation (3) Academic achievement (4) College Exams and (5) Interview & References
- 6. Interviews: Not all applicants will be granted interviews. Applications will be judged objectively, and interviews will be granted based on scoring of the applications. Written notification will be provided to all contestants as to their need to participate in an interview. The only approved absence from an interview will be a UIL, FFA, FCCLA or 4-H competition. ONLY an extenuating circumstance other than these approved events will be discussed and decided by Scholarship Committee on a case by case basis.
