As previously shared on August 14, Father Jerry remains temporarily removed from the public exercise of priestly ministry following a report of behavior that is not consistent with the Archdiocese's safe environment policies, which apply to all clergy, staff, and volunteers. This measure was taken as a precaution, not punishment, and it remains in effect at this time.

As of today, an investigation by law enforcement is ongoing. The Archdiocese is fully cooperating with this process. In line with standard protocol, Archbishop Shawn McKnight has paused the Church's internal process until the civil investigation is concluded.

We know this situation has been painful and confusing. Moments like this test us, not just in what we believe, but in how we love and show care for those around us. Please know that the concern brought forward was serious and credible, and the Archdiocese took appropriate action to protect the well-being of all. These steps are never taken lightly.

We urge you to avoid speculation, gossip, or division. Those who came forward are members of our community and deserve compassion, not judgment. So does Father Jerry. This is a time for unity, not sides.
