# **First Penance Parent Meeting:**

Next Sunday, September 29<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am in the school hall, Fr. Monroe and Karen Barrows will meet with parents of children who will be preparing for First Communion this year. During the Fall months, the children are preparing to make a First Confession. This meeting will introduce that program to the parents.



Last Monday evening, September 16<sup>th</sup>, Fr. Monroe met with 28 of our parishioners at an informational reception in Rieger Hall. The purpose of the gathering was to present to them the specifics of the capital campaign and invite them to consider what they might be able to do. They will be the lead group of contributors inviting the rest of the parish to prayerfully consider what they might be able to do over the next four years.

Invitations are being mailed to other parishioners who regularly support the parish financially to attend one of four other receptions planned in early October.

These receptions will also take place in Rieger Hall on Wednesday, October 2<sup>nd</sup> at 12 noon and at 6:30 pm and on Monday, October 7<sup>th</sup> at 12 noon and at 6:30 pm.

As has been mentioned in earlier articles and pulpit announcements, the purpose of this campaign is to solidify endowments for various diocesan ministries and needs (60% of money raised) and help parishes address local needs (40% of money raised). In other words, 40% of what our parishioners contribute during the next 4 years will be returned to OLA for us to determine how to use it for our parish purposes.

When your receive your invitation, please consider coming to one of these gatherings. Refreshments will be served, and they will last about one hour.

# DO YOU KNOW OF ANYONE INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC?
